ISN'T IT A TRIBLE strange that the "general business depression," the "wreck and ruin to manufacturing and commercial interests" which the Democratic state platform charges to the McKinley tariff did not materialize until the Democrats got hold of the government and threatened to smash that tariff?

collapse of inflated values is a disaster from which, with prompt and prudent readjustment, we may hope speedily to recover and be better for the wholesome correction, and from which oftentimes the more conservative and stable lines of business suffer comparatively little injury.

IT WAS UNDER the burden of that disadvantage that we fell into the present depression, and it is because we are still under that burden that the outlook for complete and speedy relief is not bright.

GET AFTER THE BURGLARS. It is evident to any one who has kept watch of the burglaries and burglarious assaults committed in this city within the past few months that something is radically wrong with the protection afforded to those who pay taxes that they may sleep in peace or walk abroad after night-fall without carrying arsenals.

WE DO NOT pretend to know where the fault lies; but it is indisputable that there is a fault, and that it is a bad one. The system which enables burglars to enter houses in broad daylight; permits highwaymen to ply their vocation at eventide on much frequented streets, and which even fails to keep thieves and robbers out of the municipal building, is a wrong system, a weak system, and a system wholly out of keeping with the magnitude, wealth and importance of the third city in this state.

Obviously, then, if the police force of Scranton is too small to guard the city of Scranton as it should be guarded, it should be enlarged. Better far, that people who own homes in this city should feel secure enough to sleep in them than that they should have new bridges or new parks.

IT IS A SQUARE ISSUE. Despite the obscurity of their nominee and the inevitable recurrence of shallow demagogism in the framing of their platform—notably in the pitifully transparent effort to charge the existing business depression to a tariff which, during the two years of its fair trial, had begun to start American industries upon a new course of profitable and general activity—the Democrats of Pennsylvania, grown unexpectedly bold, have courted a square issue between protection and free trade.
