NIAGARA ECLIPSED.—An excursion party is forming in Helena, Montana, to visit the falls of the Yellowstone, where it is said the whole volume of the river is precipitated over a precipice 1,600 feet high, and loses itself in a lake twenty-five or thirty miles in circumference, which contains an island of several hundred acres area, covered with boiling springs.
