THE SUFFRAGE QUESTION IN OHIO. The constitutional amendment is defeated. The next Legislature, being Democratic, will not propose a similar one. Therefore no amendment to strike the word "white" out of the State Constitution can be submitted to the people until the election for Governor and Legislature in 1871, as the Constitution provides that amendments to the popular vote shall be submitted only at elections at which members of the Assembly were to be chosen. But, under the Constitution, the question whether a constitutional convention to revise, alter and amend the Constitution, shall be held, will be submitted to the people at the election of 1871. As the present Constitution is seriously defective in many respects, such a convention will doubtless be voted for by both parties. In that case, according to the Constitution, the Legislature elected at that election "shall provide, by law, for the election of delegates and the assembling of such convention." All amendments to the Constitution, adopted by a constitutional convention, must be submitted to the people and adopted by a majority of those voting thereon, before they are part of the Constitution. We presume, therefore, that this question will go over until the constitutional convention of 1871, which we propose to make an equal suffrage convention.—Cleveland Leader.
