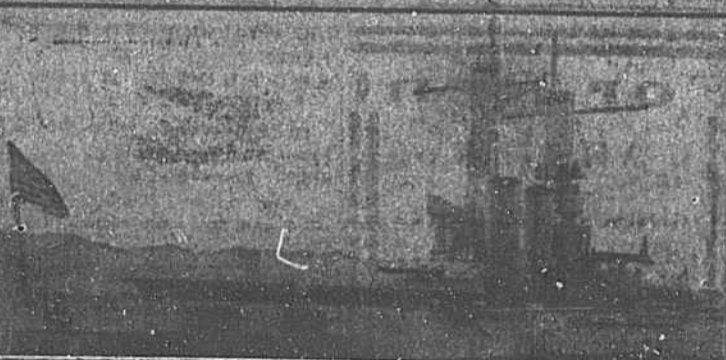

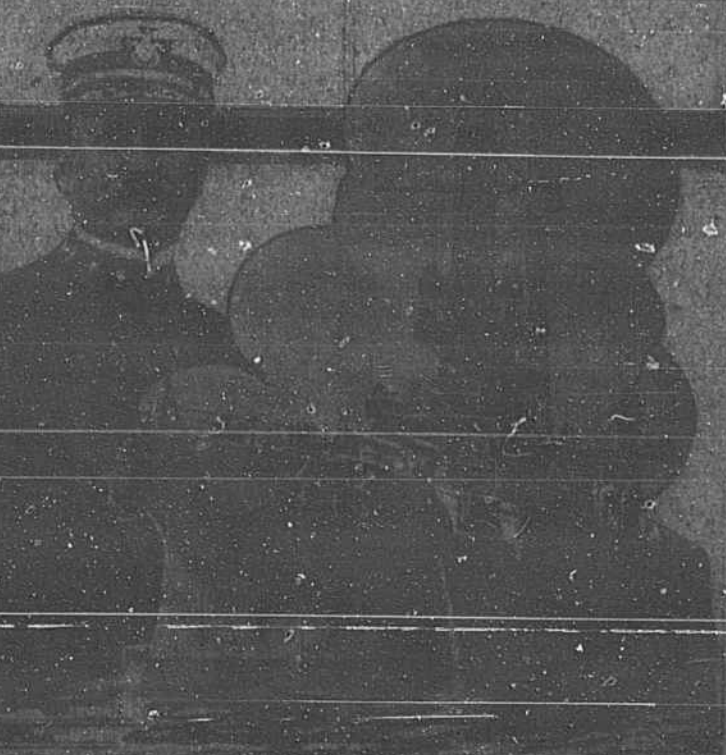

THE DAY IN CONGRESS  
Washington, May 1.—The day in Senate met at noon.  
Being debate on toll exemption repeal bill.  
Senator Thomas urged senators to refrain from expression as to who is to blame for the Colombia strike situation, that "impaired sentiment may be allayed."  
Intercourse commerce subcommittee reported administration trade commission bill.  
Adjourned at 5:30 p. m. until noon Saturday.  
House met at noon.  
Debate on naval appropriation bill resumed. Hearings continued on subcommittee on water power bill and by agricultural committee on oil patents and grain administration legislation.  
Judiciary subcommittee began hearings on charges against Associate Justice Wright, of District of Columbia Supreme Court.  
Agreed to give right of way to proposed Panama canal, authorizing with appropriations bill and several days.  
Adjourned at 6:15 p. m. until noon Saturday.

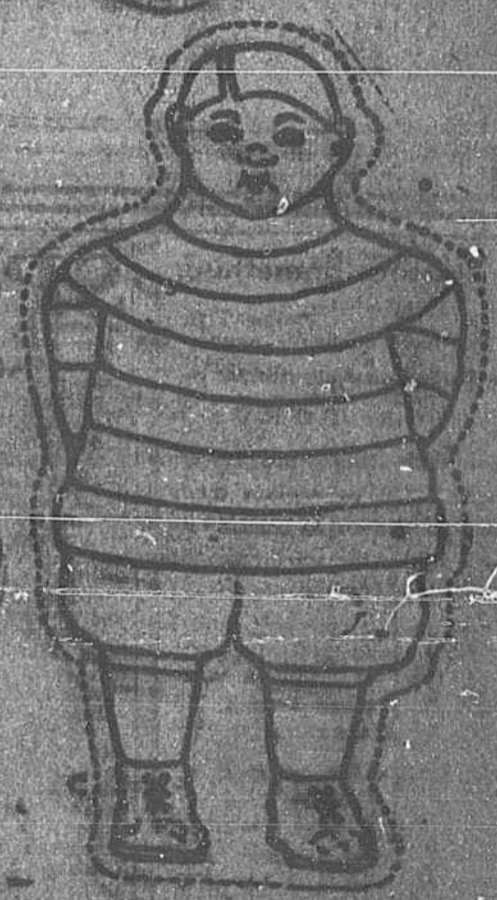
