### Try A Dollar's Worth.

The South Dakota Horticultural Society, a state institution existing under special enactment of the legislature for the express work of disseminating valuable information regarding gardening and farming, wants more people that take an interest in its doings. It therefore makes an offer of 100 seeds of Cossack Alfalfa, and a copy of the Annual Report of the S. D. State Horticultural society for a total of \$2.

The Cossack variety is spoken of as having immense possibilities. The seed of this plant, together with the seeds of other varieties of alfalfa, were introduced by Prof. N. E. Hanson of Brookings, who returning from an agricultural exploration through Europe and northern Asia, in 1906 and 1908, as the representative of the national department of agriculture. The supply, coming as it does, from very frail beginnings, is very limited, and parties wishing some must make haste. Those who so desire, may secure 100 seeds of the Obb, Siberia, alfalfa, instead of the Cossack. Address Prof. N. E. Hanson, Sec. S. D. Hort. Society, Brookings, S. D.

### PROTECT LIVES AT TIENSIN

Foreign Commanders Evolve Plan to Patrol City.

Tientsin, China, March 7.—The commanders of the foreign detachments stationed here have elaborated a scheme for the joint patrolling of the city when such a measure is found to be necessary.

The Japanese troops, who have arrived from Manchuria, have taken up their quarters in the city.

The Chinese authorities have requested the immediate dispatch of Chinese troops to Tientsin to maintain order here. It is certain that the commanders of the detachments of foreign troops will not allow Chinese reinforcements to approach within seven miles of Tientsin.

### FELONY TO BE THE CHARGE HEREAFTER

### Suffragettes Face Long Terms Behind the Bars.

London, March 7.—"From now on all women who break the laws will be treated the same as everyone else who commits a crime," declared Inspector McCarthy of the London police in outlining the plans of the city authorities to stamp out the property destroying tactics of the militant suffragettes.

McCarthy engineered the raid on the suffragette headquarters and is in active charge of the work of repression.

This announcement brought home to the suffragettes the seriousness of their recent demonstration. It is to be war hereafter and every woman who through loyalty injures property will face a felony prosecution. Conspiracy charges will be lodged from now on, according to McCarthy, against every militant suffragette.

The penalty on conviction may be seven years' imprisonment. The first three persons to face the charge are Mr. and Mrs. Pethick Lawrence and Miss Christabel Pankhurst, arrested on warrants. They will be tried speedily and if convicted will receive severe felons' sentences.

The thing that hurts the suffragettes the most is the avowed intention of the government to attach the funds of the organization to reimburse persons who suffered loss in the raids.

The cash of the suffragettes, amounting to more than \$500,000, will be held and when the government is compelled to replace glass broken from the raids and to pay for other damage resulting this money will be used. This is possible under English law and it is known Premier Asquith believes this method will soon put an end to destructive demonstrations.

### GILL AGAIN TURNED DOWN

Municipal Ownership Mayor Elected at Seattle.

Seattle, March 7.—Complete unofficial figures from 274 out of 281 precincts in the municipal elections indicate the election of George F. Cotterill, municipal ownership candidate for mayor, over Hiram C. Gill, "open town" candidate, by 1,000 to 2,000 majority.

Cotterill's managers also declare the charter amendment establishing the single tax system in Seattle has passed by a substantial plurality.

Gill, who was mayor a year ago, was recalled principally through the votes of the women, who cast their ballots for the first time at that election. He sought the mayoralty again this time as a vindication.

### BODIES TAKEN FROM RUINS

Remains of Three Wisconsin Boarding House Victims Recovered.

Platteville, Wis., March 7.—Three charred bodies were taken from the ruins of a laborers' boarding house that burned here late Tuesday. The men, all of whom were foreigners, were trapped by the flames.
