



Superintendent Allen Promoted

We are pleased to announce that Superintendent Allen has received a deserved promotion, although we regret that Chilocco must lose so capable a superintendent.

He is to assume direction of the affairs of the Menominees of Wisconsin, whose agency is at Keshena. His special knowledge of the requirements of this district, from former experience, made him the Commissioner's choice at a time when the large forests of this reservation are to be drawn upon on a large scale.

His transfer will mean a loss to Chilocco, a gain to the Menominees and a menace to the Kaiser.

During his seven years' direction Chilocco has accomplished much.

We hope to be able to show a likeness of our long-time superintendent and editor in the next issue, for by that time his censorship will not prevent it. He will enter upon his new duties on April 1st.

Mr. O. H. Lipps, Chief Supervisor of Schools, will assume charge pending an appointment. As Supervisor Lipps was assistant superintendent here several years ago and later Superintendent of the Carlisle school, neither the school nor the work will be new to him.

Mrs. Allen will be greatly missed in the activities of the school to which she has given life and enthusiasm. As president of the Red Cross she has infused into the members the energy needed for success, while her helpful suggestions and attention to the business part of the work made it easier for the society as a whole

to accomplish the results they have been able to show. As postmistress she has been brought into closer contact with all the employees than often falls to the lot of a superintendent's wife, and she will be correspondingly missed.
