Railway "Vacationists" Send Letter to Wilson—Payne Submits Report.

WAGE AWARD SUFFICIENT

(Chicago, June 22.—The "railway vacationists" men who quit work April 1 in defiance of the regularly recognized brotherhoods—today sent a letter to President Wilson and Secretary Payne, asking that the strikers will accept a settlement which does not provide for their return to the seniority rank held before they quit work.

The letter follows reports that the brotherhoods would accept a settlement to the president to bring about a speedy settlement of the strike.

No Action Necessary.
