OVERMAN BILL LITTLE CHANGED

Measure Passes Senate Judiciary Committee—Ready to Go to Senate.

Washington, March 20.—Retaining substantially the legislation asked by President Wilson to give him broad powers to reorganize and co-ordinate government departments and agencies in prosecuting the war, the Overman bill, advanced as an administration substitute for the senate military committee's war cabinet and munitions director measure, was ordered favorably reported today by the senate judiciary committee by a vote of 11 to 7.

The principal provision of the bill as it now goes to the senate, where a bitter contest is predicted by its opponents, authorizes the president "to make such redistribution of functions among executive agencies as he may deem necessary" during the war.

U. S. Senator Broussard, Of Louisiana, Very Ill

New Iberia, La., March 20.—United States Senator Robert F. Broussard is reported critically ill at his home here today. Two specialists from New Orleans and local physicians early this week performed an operation on Senator Broussard for infusion of blood, which they said was successful, but other complications developed bringing on a serious condition, according to the physicians.

German Headquarters Organizes Conferences

Zurich, March 20.—Another of the reports of an impending German blow in the west appears in the Koelnische Zeitung. It says the German headquarters staff is organizing a series of conferences, the first of which will be held at Cologne, Berlin, Karlsruhe, Hanover and Leipzig, with representatives of the leading newspapers for the purpose of preparing the German press for operations on a great scale on the western front.

MISSIONARY WORK TOPIC AT MEMPHIS

Laymen's and Ministers' Conference of M. E. Church, South, in Session. Memphis, March 20.—Surveys of foreign mission fields and discussion of the needs for missionary work both at home and abroad made up the program for today's session of the conference of ministers and laymen of the Methodist Episcopal church, South, meeting here with delegates from the Northern and Canadian branches of the church to plan for the participation of the Southern church in a proposed world-wide missionary campaign in celebration of the centennial of the founding of the Methodist missionary board.

MEATLESS DAYS FAIL TO CONSERVE SUPPLY

Increase in Consumption, According to Washington Food Administration. Washington, March 20.—Meatless days have not conserved the meat supply, Joseph P. Cotton, head of the food administration's meat division, today told the senate committee investigating food supplies, but on the other hand, he believed it had resulted in more meat being consumed on those days.

ACTIVITIES OF GERMAN ALLIANCE INVESTIGATED

Washington, March 20.—Adolph Timm, of Philadelphia, secretary of the German-American Alliance, was today before the senate committee investigating the organization's alleged disloyal activities. As custodian of the records of the alliance, Timm appeared today for discussion of the organization's finances and general activities.

FALL OF METROPOLIS OF RUSSIA NOW IMMINENT

(Associated Press Review.) The fall of Petrograd is imminent.

German troops, probably advancing along the Baltic coast from Narva and northeast from Pskov and Dvinsk, are nearing the Russian metropolis, according to dispatches received in London.

The population is said to be awaiting the coming of the invaders passively and there are no indications that the bolshevik authorities will attempt to oppose the Germans before giving up the city.

Evacuation of Petrograd by the bolshevik government departments was ordered last week and all are now in Moscow, while the Lenin government has declared the Russian capital. When the order to move to Moscow was given, it was said that Petrograd probably would be declared a free port.

RUSS RELATIONS WITH ENTENTE UNCHANGED

Bolshevik Foreign Minister Views U. S. Attitude as Growing More Friendly.

Moscow, Tuesday, March 19.—(By the Associated Press.)—Russia's relations with the entente are unchanged, M. Tchitcherine, the bolshevik foreign minister, declared in an interview with the Associated Press correspondent today.

More friendly relations were being established with the United States, he added, and he commented upon President Wilson's message to Russia as showing the American would not take oppressive action against her.

Leon Trotsky and other bolshevik leaders are quoted here as denying rumors that large numbers of Austrian-German prisoners have been armed by the bolsheviks at Irkutsk, Chita and other Siberian cities, as well as in European Russia.

FLYER KILLED AT OUTSET OF CROSS-COUNTRY TRIP

First Lieutenant Walter Johnson, of Bellevue, Ill., in Accident at Kelly Field.

San Antonio, Tex., March 20.—First Lieut. Walter J. Johnson, 22 years old, of Bellevue, Ill., was instantly killed today when the airplane in which he was flying fell 1,500 feet at Kelly Field.

Americans to Probe Reports in Siberia

Petrograd, Tuesday, March 19.—(By the Associated Press.)—An American mission will visit Siberia to investigate reports of the arming of prisoners of war.

WORLD'S TONNAGE FALLEN 2,500,000 DURING WAR

Sir Eric Geddes, First Lord of British Admiralty, Reports Shipping Situation.

London, March 20.—Figures on the shipping output and tonnage losses of Great Britain will be published regularly hereafter, it was announced in the house of commons today by Sir Eric Campbell Geddes, the first lord of the admiralty, during the debate on the navy ship building bill.

SPY SUSPECTS ARE ONLY UNDESIRABLE CITIZENS

Quartet to Be Deported Under That Charge—Love Affair Basis of Activity.

Washington, March 20.—Investigation has convinced the department of justice that the two women and the two men claiming French citizenship recently arrested in New York on suspicion of connection with the German spy ring, can only be classed as undesirable citizens, rather than as spies.

Suspicion that the quartette was a band of spies were exploded when government agents found that a love affair between one of the women and a neutral diplomat in Washington was the real basis for the activity of the four, which had brought them under the observation of the department of justice.

PROSECUTION OF TAX SLACKERS TO BE VIGOROUS

Washington, March 20.—Tax slackers, who fail to file their income tax report by April 1, will be prosecuted as vigorously and relentlessly under the war revenue act as draft slackers were under the selective service act, according to a statement made today by Daniel C. Roper, commissioner of internal revenue. Revenue officers in every section of the country are checking up returns with a view to beginning prosecutions against tax dodgers.

Laden Grain Steamer Sunk Result Collision

Berne, Tuesday, March 19.—It has been learned through official sources that the steamer Sterling, with a large cargo of grain for Switzerland, has just been sunk as the result of a collision.

Copenhagen, Monday, March 18.—Germany should not indulge in delusions that world peace has been accomplished yet, Count Von Hertling, the imperial German chancellor, declared in concluding his speech in the reichstag today on the peace treaty with Russia. He added:
