DRASTIC LAWS TO PUNISH SPIES

Pressure for Legislation Coming From All Parts of Country—Mob Violence Feared.

JUSTICE HAMPERED

By Willingness of Judges to Render Decisions Based on Technicalities.

(By David Lawrence.) (Copyright, 1918, by New York Evening Post.) Washington, April 9.—Pressure for drastic legislation, which shall deal severely and expeditiously with German propagandists and spies, is coming from all parts of the country and should continue especially in the next few days when congress deliberates on the various bills now pending.

For unless the law enforcement agencies of the government are given broad authority to deal with the multiplex cases that are arising, a resort to mob violence is feared.

Reports to the department of justice show that there is considerable more resentment in such states as Iowa, Nebraska and Montana of quasi-disloyal utterances than there is even in the east. Different sections of the country are reacting differently to the German propaganda, but the bitterest bred by such things as the discovery of poison and glass in bread.

It is precisely because congress has failed to empower the department of justice to deal at its discretion with cases of disloyalty or seditious activities of German residents, that officials really fear the situation may get out of hand in some parts of the country.

Behind the explicit powers granted to the department by congress must exist always a public opinion that will indicate to federal judges that they, too, in time of war must consider the possible menace to the country of letting aliens loose or inflicting insignificant penalties on Germans who openly take issue with the American government.

Unquestionably, Senator Hiram Johnson is right in saying that under some of the proposed legislation, people engaged in legitimate criticism of the administration can be punished and freedom of speech interfered with. But if the administration wanted to interfere

CHATTOOGA COUNTY LEADS IN GEORGIA

Lyerly, Ga., April 9.—When the day rolled up for the great drive for the third Liberty loan, Chattooga county led all the other Georgia counties. Chattooga's quota being placed at \$30,000, and early Saturday morning subscriptions amounting to \$81,000 were wired to W. C. Wardlaw, chairman of the Liberty loan executive committee, this being the first county in Georgia to report solid and to get the 1 per cent. in the hands of Mr. Wardlaw.

WOMAN DOCTOR TELLS OF CULLS OF GERMAN SYSTEM

Dr. Lovejoy, Home From France, Declares Suffering Cannot Be Exaggerated.

Atlanta, April 9.—"There is only one thing worse than death for a man—to live to be old without having done anything worth while; but for a woman to live to be the mother of a Hun and the grandmother of a generation of Huns is worse than a million deaths—it is a living death."

This statement was made here yesterday by Dr. Esther Clayton Lovejoy before a meeting of representatives of eighty Red Cross chapters in the southern division. Dr. Lovejoy was sent to France by the American Red Cross to investigate conditions of women and children in the war zone.

"Telling of her experiences at the Red Cross receiving station at Avion, France, she said: "At this station all the culls of the German military system are received."

"The children who come into the receiving station are generally stunted from lack of nourishment." Dr. Lovejoy was formerly a physician in Portland, Ore.

BRITISH PROMOTINS NO LONGER BY SENIORITY

London, April 9.—King George has signed a royal warrant providing that promotions to the rank of general in the British army shall be by selection instead of seniority. This, it is said, will make it possible for a young officer who shows brilliant abilities as a leader to jump over the heads of seniors in the service.
