Two More Moonshiners Captured in Hancock County.

Sheriff L. F. Johnson and R. O. Darnell made a general raid over the county last week in search of moonshine distillers, capturing three stills and two men. They made their first raid in the 6th District near Sneedville, and captured a still at the home of a negro preacher on Newmans ridge, but no arrest was made.

Sheriff Johnson and Mr. Darnell was again heard from about the middle of the week in the Southern part of the county in the first district, where they captured two negro men and one distillery, and destroying about 400 gallons of beer. The two negro men were brought to Sneedville before Commissioner John Livesay, but their preliminary hearing was continued until Monday April the 11. The negroes gave bond for their appearance on the above date. The general raid wound up at the end of the week in the third District, in the Eastern part of the county, where they captured one large copper still and destroyed about 500 of beer which was ready for stilling. No arrests were made.

Let the good work continue and every good citizen of the county join and help our officers in their efforts and the dameded stuff will soon be driven from among us.

Darnell, Reading Deputy, made a raid recently on the home of a colored preacher in this section of the county and captured a moonshine distillery, if the officers of the law are going to take the preachers spirits away from them how do they expect them to make a success at their calling?

MYSTERIOUS LETTER SAID TO HAVE BEEN WRITTEN BY CHRIST

Country papers throughout the United States are printing what is alleged to be a letter, written by Christ. In this letter was an injunction that it should be published to the world by whoever found it together with the statement that misfortune and bad luck would follow the person having possession of it in the event that it was not given publicity.

There was likewise a promise that whoever may have a copy of this in his or her possession will prosper and be followed by good fortune. According to the history of the letter it was written by Christ just after his crucifixion, signed by the Angel Gabriel ninety-nine years after the saviour's birth, and presumably deposited by him under a stone at the foot of the cross. On this stone appeared the legend, Blessed is he who shall turn me over."

No one knew what the inscription meant, or seemed to have sufficient curiosity to investigate until the stone was turned over by a little child and the letter which follows was discovered; Whosoever works on the Sabbath day shall be cursed. I command you to go to church and keep holy the Lord's day, without any manner of works. You shall not idle or misspend your time in bedecking yourself in superfluities of costly apparel and vain dressing for I will haze that day kept holy that your sins may be forgiven you.

"You will not break my commandments. But observe and keep them, they being written by my hand and spoken from my mouth. You shall not only go to church yourselves, but also your man servant and your maid servant. Observe my words and learn my commandments.

"You finish your work every Saturday at 6 o'clock in the afternoon, at which hour the preparation for the Sabbath begins.

I advise you to fast five days in the year, beginning on good Friday and continuing the five following in remembrance of the five wounds I received for you and for your mankind. "You shall love one another and cause them that are not baptized to come to church and receive the holy sacrament, that is to say baptized, and then the supper of the Lord, and be made a member thereof, and if so doing I will give you long life and many blessings. Your land will be replenished and bring forth abundance and I will comfort you in the greatest temptation, and surely he that doeth to the contrary shall be cursed. "I will also send hardness of the heart on them and especially that hath given to the poor shall find it profitable. Remember to keep the Sabbath day, for the seventh day I have taken as a resting day to myself. "And he that hath a copy of this letter written by my own hand and spoken by my own mouth and keep it without publishing it to others, shall not prosper, but he that publisheth it to

others shall be blessed by me, and if their sins be as many as the stars by night, and if they truly believe not this writing, and my commandment will have my plague upon you, and you will be consumed with your children, goods and cattle and all other worldly enjoyments, that I have given you.

Do but once think of what I have suffered for you; if you do, it will be well for you in this world and in the world which is to come. "Whoever shall keep a copy of this letter and keep it in the house, nothing shall hurt them, neither pestilence, thunder or lightning and if any woman be in birth and put her trust in me she shall be delivered of her child. You shall hear no more news of me except through the holy Scriptures, until the day of judgement. All goodness and prosperity shall be in the house where a copy of this letter shall be found. Finished."

EDD BRAY MURDERED BY WILL RINGLEY.

On last Saturday March 28, Edd Bray was shot with a shot-gun and instantly killed by Will Ringley. Bray went to Ringley's home about two or three o'clock in the evening and Ringley and his wife and Bray were all sitting in the porch, when Ringley got up from his chair and went in the house, he says "to get his pipe" but instead of getting a pipe he got a shot-gun and without any words deliberately took the life of Bray; but he claims that he did it on account of conduct which he saw through the window between his wife and Bray as he went after his pipe. It is the general talk of the neighborhood that Bray and Ringley's wife were intimate with each other, and friends of both parties had been warped of the relations between Bray and Ringley's wife.

Ringley surrendered himself to the Officers immediately after the killing and a preliminary hearing was set for Wednesday March 30, at which time the defendant announced not ready and was remanded to jail without bond. The trial was continued until Saturday, April 2, at Sneedville, before Clay Tread and O. S. Horton, Justices of the Peace.
