THANKSGIVING. How it was Observed Here Yesterday.

The old Puritan holiday, first established by the early settlers away back in 1623, three years after the Plymouth Rock landing, has become a national affair, and was yesterday generally observed from the Atlantic to the Pacific.

Here the custom had many thousands of observers. Any one who cared to know how the day would be spent, had only to drop into the places where edibles were sold on Wednesday evening.

In addition to the extra spread at private residences, which, as before remarked, was general, public houses had in many instances an extra repast.

Where ordinary lunches are usually set, hot oyster soup and sliced turkey with oyster dressing and a hot potato was served, while hot drinks, cheer and conviviality ruled in all circles.

Through the doors of store houses were generally open, no business of importance transpired, and but few people strolled the highways except folk in nester attire than usual.

Numerous people took trips out of town. Some went on hunting tours to Nonconah bottom and elsewhere, others left by steamer for up or down the river, and still others passed the day in the quietude of their family circles, before a comfortable fire.

Services were held at various churches, and the religious ceremonies were generally suited to the occasion.

It may be well to mention that the first general Thanksgiving Day ever proclaimed was 104 years ago, when Washington at Valley Forge issued a call upon his army and its friends to join in giving thanks to, and asking the blessings of the Great Giver of all good.
