The disastrous results of making a gratuitous nomination for office was fully illustrated in the last Presidential election. Greely received only six thousand three hundred and fifty-eight votes in Shelby county, while the Democratic ticket in this county received in the recent election nearly eleven thousand votes. Horace Greely was not the man for the emergency. He was not the man for the leadership in such a crusade against extravagance.

There were northern Democrats who could not, and would not support him, because of his long-life antagonism to the principles of their party; and there were southern Democrats, who, while sympathizing with the liberal movement, were unable to accept his championship to him. And it was in this way that the very essence of victory defied, disastrous defeat fell upon the Conservative cause of the patriots who were seeking to save the country and not to promote a party. It was in this way the wise purpose of the true men of both sections was frustrated. It was in this way that Tennessee had the mortification of seeing more than twice ten thousand of her most intelligent, public-spirited and devoted men holding their ballots blank, refusing to take part in the election. Like causes will produce like results.
