The Home Journal has not given, and will not give, publicity to the dirty scandals in regard to the Democratic and Republican candidates for President.

They are too indecent. They are invasions of the private lives of these gentlemen, and have naught to do with the fitness for the great office to which their respective parties wish them elected.

Our opinion is based upon the inflexible will and disregard of public abuse with which he has performed his duties as Mayor of Buffalo and Governor of New York.

Thomas Ewing, living near Nashville, one night recently, thought a burglar was trying to enter his house. In 1845, in Illinois, as a young man fairly in the political field, he voted for a constitutional provision prohibiting any negro or mulatto from settling in the State of Illinois. He also voted against giving negroes the right of suffrage or to hold office.

In 1853 John A. Logan was a member of the Illinois Legislature, and as a member of the Judiciary Committee reported the following bill and labored for its passage: "If a negro or mulatto, bond or free, shall heretofore come into this State and remain ten days with the evident intention of residing in the same, every such negro or mulatto shall be deemed guilty of a high misdemeanor, and for the first offense shall be fined the sum of fifty dollars."

In another issue of the Home Journal we will give you more of Logan's record, wherein he came nearly being a Confederate ally in his favor of the colored race.
