DECISIONS OF THE SUPREME COURT.

Nashville, December Term, 1866. Helen Surer v. J. A. L. P. Green, et al. This is a suit commenced by the Circuit Court of Davidson county, in which Helen Surer, Administratrix of Charles Surer, and her four minor children, who sue by her as next friend, to recover \$8,000, and the interest thereon, being the amount of a promissory note, payable to the plaintiff, Helen Surer, as the Administratrix of Charles Surer, which is alleged, the defendant fraudulently obtained the possession of, by paying the same to an unauthorized agent, in Confederate currency. There are four counts in the declaration, basing the facts, to which the defendant pleaded several pleas; that the notes were paid and voluntarily delivered to the defendant. A demurrer was filed, but on the trial of the case, the objection to the pleadings was withdrawn, and the cause submitted to the court upon the law and facts, waving the intervention of a jury.

HEADQUARTERS TEXAS STATE GUARDS, NASHVILLE, March 6, 1867. General Order No. 1. Captain of companies, to whom communications have been forwarded, together with a copy of this order, are authorized to enlist for the period of three months, unless sooner discharged, one hundred able bodied men, who receive credit shall proceed to elect their officers, who shall be commissioned when the captain returns to certify the same to me at the headquarters, each company in the service to be mustered as infantry.
