### America's Apple Crop.

New York, Oct. 29.—Throughout the States of chief commercial production, including New England and New York, the crop of winter apples is large, according to the special report in the New England Home stead, which places the aggregate yield at a shade under 59 million barrels for all of the United States against 60,500,000 barrels in 1895 and 57,000,000 barrels two years ago. This authority says the crop in New England, New York, Michigan and parts of a few other states is phenomenal. New England and New York alone have over 16 million barrels against a little more than 7 million a year ago, while Michigan is harvesting the greatest crop of fine fruit ever secured in that State. The report covering the Central West, however, shows that in many instances the crop is insufficient to supply the home requirements. The Canada crop is among the largest on record. Exports from the Atlantic coast are already one million barrels or a third more than all of last season.
