### Casualty List Reported Today

WASHINGTON, Sept. 20.—General Pershing has reported the following casualties today:

Killed in action, 39; missing in action, 51; wounded severely, 84; died of wounds, 10; died from aeroplane accident, 1; wounded, degree undetermined, 3; died of disease, 3; died from accidents and other causes, 5. Total, 196.

Private Robert A. Nichols, Good-bury, Tenn., died from disease.

Robert M. Leonard, Jonesboro, Tenn., Route 4, dead from accident. Lawrence L. Wynne, Anderson, Tenn.; Clatie R. Cunningham, Watson, Tenn.; Ben B. Simpson, Lafayette, Tenn.; Elbert L. Tompkins, Rugby, Tenn., missing in action.

### German Subs May Be Responsible For Influenza

WASHINGTON, Sept. 20.—Widespread appearance of Spanish influenza along the Atlantic coast recalls warning of navy officials through the United Press some weeks ago that German submarines may be responsible.

Lieut.-Col. P. S. Doane, head of the health section of the shipping board, today reiterated the warning. He declared, "it is quite possible the epidemic was started by Huns sent ashore by boche submarine commanders. We know that men have been sent ashore from German submarine boats and it would be quite easy for these agents to turn loose the germs in theaters and other places where large numbers of people are assembled."

When the original warning went out, it followed the capture and retention by U-boat commanders of crews and passengers from torpedoed ships and their ultimate release again. It was feared then that these prisoners might have been inoculated with the germs and then released to spread them. Exceptional care was taken to guard against this.

The fact that the disease has appeared particularly in cities where there are army or navy training camps adds strength to the theory that Germans may have disseminated the germs.

### Russian Empress, Four Princesses Are Killed

LONDON, Sept. 19.—The former Russian dowager empress and three princesses and two grand duchesses, whose names are not reported, were burned to death about a month after the Russian emperor was shot according to a story reaching London. The source of the story is given consideration in some quarters and an investigation has been started.

After the former emperor was shot the women were taken to an isolated village, according to the present report, and made prisoners in a residence. They were there only a few days when a crowd of bolsheviks attacked the house. The women barricaded the doors and the house was set on fire. All the persons in the house perished.

There have been various reports as to the fate of the former Russian empress and her daughters. A London newspaper on September 12th reported that she and her four daughters had been murdered by the bolsheviks. This report was denied a few days later by the bolshevik foreign minister.

### Bulgars In Flight; Burning As They Go

(By The United Press.) LONDON, Sept. 19.—The Bulgarians are in flight in Macedonia and are burning stores and villages, according to a Serbian official statement received here.

The allied troops now have advanced more than twelve miles and their progress is so rapid that they have not been able to count the prisoners and war material taken. New regiments thrown in by the Bulgarians have been forced to retreat with the others.

### Will Assign Soldiers To Places They Fit

WASHINGTON, Sept. 19.—To obtain men who have demonstrated their ability in commercial life for work in the army, the war department has appealed to manufacturers and business men to submit names of their employes, with such qualifications who come in the early draft classifications. The general staff plans to place the men in positions similar to those they held in civil life, thereby increasing the efficiency of the various branches of the war department.
