TAFT'S INJUNCTION BILL

Measure Dealing with a Subject in Which the President is Much Interested is Introduced

Washington, Feb. 18.—What is generally recognized as the administration bill on the important subject of the regulation of court injunctions was introduced today by representative R. O. Moon, republican, of Pennsylvania, chairman of the committee on revision of laws. The phraseology of this particular bill is expected to be given careful scrutiny. It deals with a subject in which the president has been deeply interested and which he has been anxious to see enacted into law in careful form which would redeem the pledges of his party on the subject and at the same time constitute no drastic innovation in legal procedure.
 The bill is a brief one, covering a single typewritten sheet. In effect it provides that no injunction, whether interlocutory or permanent, shall be issued by any federal court or judge without previous notice and an opportunity to be heard on behalf of the parties enjoined.
 But it says further, if there appears a probability that "immediate and irreparable injury" is likely to ensue, the court may issue a temporary restraining order without notice.
 It is required that every such order shall define the injury, state why irreparable and why granted without notice, and shall not extend more than seven days from the time the notice is served.
