THE SITUATION BEFORE RICHMOND.

The ominous silence that followed the dispatches bringing intelligence of the operations in front of Richmond down to Saturday night gave rise to the most painful and oppressive apprehensions in the public mind.

The first dispatches received yesterday announcing the retreat of the army seventeen miles, the capture of his siege guns, and the abandonment of many sick and wounded...

The rebels crossed the Chickahominy on Sunday in great force, on the line of our retreat, but not following it till Monday, when a simultaneous attack was made upon the right and left of the attacking force...

The famous Stonewall Jackson is reported among the killed, and General Anderson, of the Fredericksburg Iron Works, mortally wounded.

HOSPITAL REGULATIONS FOR THE DISTRICT OF WEST TENNESSEE. ARTICLE 1st.—ADMISSIONS, DISTRIBUTIONS OF PATIENTS.

SECTION 1. As it is desirable to avoid the crowding of patients in the permanent hospitals, none will be admitted who are not constantly, or in great part confined to their beds...
