STATEHOOD QUESTION.

Advises Citizens of Arizona That This May Be Last Opportunity.

Chicago, July 4.—A dispatch to the Tribune from Tucson, Ariz., says: President Roosevelt is so anxious for Arizona to become a State that he has written a personal letter to his old friend, Mark A. Rogers, urging the people to vote to be admitted with New Mexico. The President says that he believes if the present opportunity is not seized it may be many years before the opportunity may be had again. President Roosevelt's letter, which was received yesterday, reads:

"The White House, Washington, June 27.—Dear Mark A. Rogers, Secretary Arizona Statehood Association, Tucson, Ariz.: My earnest hope is that the people of the Territory of Arizona in their wisdom will decide to enter the Union as part of the great State of Arizona. No man can foretell what will happen in the future.

LAST CHANCE.

"But it is my true belief that if the people of Arizona let this chance go by, they will have to wait many years before the chance again offers itself, and even then it probably will be only on the present terms—that is, on the condition of being joined with New Mexico.

"If the people of Arizona come in now they will achieve what every self-respecting American ought to wish to achieve—that is, the right of self government. If they refuse what is proffered them—and what, in my opinion, is proffered on the only proper and permissible terms—they condemn themselves to an indefinite continuance of a condition of tutelage.

"I have a peculiar affection for the people of the four territories, which under the act of Congress I have just signed, now have the opportunity to enter as two States into our Federal Union. These territories are filled with men and women of the stamp for which I grew to feel so hearty a regard and respect during the years that I myself lived and worked on the great plains and in the Rocky Mountains.

HIS REGIMENT.

"It was from these four territories that I raised the regiment in which I took part in the Cuban campaign. Assuredly under no circumstances would I advise the people of these territories to do anything that I considered to be against their moral or their material well being. I feel that for them now to refuse to come into the Union as stated would be at the best mere folly.

"Very wisely the people of Oklahoma and Indian Territory, and I believe the people of New Mexico also, have abandoned an attitude which forbade their thus assuming the great privileges and responsibilities of full American citizenship. I cannot express to heartily my hope that the people of Arizona, exercising their sober second thought, will come to look at the matter in the same light.

The Joint Debate.

Tennessee Democracy ought to be well satisfied with appointment of Mr. Henry B. Morrow as chairman of the State committee. Mr. Morrow has demonstrated his ability as a fighting campaign manager. His services in this capacity during the Patterson-Cox campaign make it manifest that when the Republicans take the field against him and General Patterson they will discover that they have more on their hands than a mere formal battle, for Mr. Morrow knows how to originate sledge-hammer movements when he has so able a candidate as General Patterson to conduct the blow against the enemy.

The committee apparently favors the joint debate between Gen. Patterson and any candidate Tennessee Republicans can bring to the front. Always the joint debate

between opponents of different political persuasion is instructive to the people; always it is entertaining and unless there be uncommon reasons for declining the face to face meeting of the candidates, he who shrinks it is looked upon as fearing it.

Of late, however, candidates have shown a disposition to play a lone hand in campaigning, and it may be that neither party will extend an invitation for the joint debate; but we think the Democratic committee would make no mistake should it issue such an invitation, for without doubt, Democracy's candidate for governor can easily hold his own with any man in the State.—Commercial Appeal.

STATE CONVENTION

Y. P. S. C. E. Meets in Chattanooga Next Month.

The annual convention of the Christian Endeavorers of Tennessee will be held in Chattanooga July 5 to 8 inclusive.

The entertainment of the delegates is being carefully looked after. The entertaining committee will, as far as possible, assign delegates to the homes of local Endeavorers and their friends. The committee is endeavoring to secure uniform rates of \$1.00 per day for lodging and meals, 75 cents for lodging alone.
