HABEAS CORPUS CASE.

Judge Matthews Holds Commitment Irregular. Case Set for Dec. 2.

In the case of the State of Tennessee ex rel. vs. Sam H. Borum, Sheriff of Davidson County, better known as the Reelfoot Lake Nightrider habeas corpus case, Judge Thos. E. Matthews, sitting in the First Circuit Court of Davidson County Tuesday morning, held, in substance, that while the arrest and commitment of Tom Johnson and the other eight alleged Nightriders now being held in the Davidson County jail by the sheriff and executive authority was irregular, that further examination of the nine pending cases had adjourned until December 2, when the nine petitions in the meantime to be held in Davidson County jail, and on December 2 he shall examine the same and shall either commit them with or without bail, or discharge them.

The effect of this opinion is to make chapter 149, Acts of the General Assembly, constitutional and the Governor in holding any prisoners under the act of the Legislature is void.
