Socialist in Trouble.

St. Paul, Minn., Nov. 11.—F. D. Warren, of Girard, Kans., editor of the paper, "Appeal to Reason," must serve a term of six months in the federal prison at Leavenworth, Kans., and pay a fine of \$1,000 imposed by a jury in the United States court in Kansas. The sentence of the court was affirmed by an order of the United States Circuit Court of Appeals, filed to-day.

Judge Hook wrote the opinion, and Judge Adams and Reed concurred.

Warren was accused of sending through the United States mails envelopes on the outside of which was printed "\$1,000 reward will be paid to any person who kidnaps ex-Governor Taylor and returns him to the Kentucky authorities."

The indictment charged that the words were scurrilous, defamatory and threatening in character, and intended to reflect injuriously on the character of William S. Taylor, a former Governor of Kentucky.

The opinion of Judge Hook held that Congress had almost unlimited power to prescribe postal regulations, and that whether true or false the outside of an envelope was no place for them.

Nashville, Tenn., Nov. 21.—In Democratic circles the claim becomes stronger day by day that the regulars will have enough votes to organize the House and control action on all Democratic measures. It is said this result will be attained through a number of independent delegates entering the caucus.

The liquor question will not, it is said, be considered in the caucus. Each member will be left to vote as he pleases on liquor bills. This control, it is pointed out, will enable the regulars to elect United States Senator, Treasurer, Comptroller and members of the State Board of Election Commissioners.

With the beginning of another week there was increased activity among the politicians. There are a number of members-elect of the General Assembly in the city to-day, and other politicians interested in developments are also here.

From now on it may be expected that there will be steadily increasing activity in connection with plans for the organization and conduct of the coming Legislature.

The harmony talk continues, but nothing definite has been done.

It was reported in Nashville this morning that the grand jury of DeKalb County had taken up the investigation of the alleged tampering with the poll books in five districts in the recent Senatorial race.

It was reported that a large number of witnesses are being examined in the matter.
