BOHUMIR KRYL and his band will be one of the leading musical features of the forthcoming Chautauqua program. Kryl, according to the Los Angeles Times, is beyond any question the greatest cornetist in the world, and the Cincinnati Enquirer speaks of him as a great conductor and the head of a great band. He was working as a sculptor and as such had achieved no little fame, when he laid down the chisel and took up the cornet at the suggestion of no less a great personage than the world famous John Philip Sousa. As a sculptor one of his famous accomplishments was the preservation of the features of the author of "Ben-Hur" in marble. This was Kryl's last piece of sculpture, and his best. Since he began his career as a musician he has directed his band in nearly all the large cities of America. He comes to the Chautauqua direct from the Riverview exposition, Chicago.

MME. LE BRUN, who is to appear at our Chautauqua as the star of the Le Brun Grand Opera company, has a repertoire of fifty operas and sings in four different languages. She has appeared at the Wagner festival performance at Worms as Elsa in "Lohengrin" and as Elizabeth in "Tannhauser" at Innsbruck. She also appeared in Karlsruhe as Leonora in "Il Trovatore" and as Marguerite in "Faust" at Nantes, France; also took part in a festival performance at Trieste. Mme. Le Brun studied under Julla Guvarotti in Milan at the age of eighteen. She also studied under Ugo Angeri, her studies, therefore, being all in the pure old Italian school. She came to America with the Royal Italian Opera company and played a season in New York. Here Mr. Henry Savage heard her and engaged her for a three years' contract as prima donna of his then English Grand Opera company, after which she returned to Europe. For the past three years she has had her own company, has made New York her headquarters and has played all the big cities of America.
