People who now hold secondary certificates will be given for the coming year some form of high school certificate good for one year only. That is, they will be placed on the same basis as if they held high school certificates. Those desiring to teach branches above the elementary grades and who have never taught, and also who are not exempt by law, will be expected to take any form of the high school examination they choose.
