## NEW REFRIGERATOR MODEL EQUIPMENT

New Service Standards for E. P. Grissom Grocery Store.

Mr. Grissom has installed in his grocery store a model new refrigerator, the highest achievement, the last word in equipment, made for the purpose of keeping and displaying fresh meats, vegetables, butter, etc. This floor case or cabinet is something like sixteen feet in length with ice boxes at each end covered in porcelain and hardwood, the middle section of heavy plate glass and hardwood where the foods are placed, and cooled to a temperature of 32 degrees, evenly distributed. One of the most important features of this refrigerator is the fact that no one of the food products in the case is affected by the other. No one takes from the other any of its native elements and therefore while in the refrigerator retains all of its own properties and tastes unchanged. This is indeed a wonderful improvement over the old system. The entire cabinet is elaborate in construction, highly finished and a handsome addition to the store. Mr. Grissom's model meat cutter is another fine invention, which he is using in paring meats, and the two make a fine combination. Mr. Grissom will be glad to have you visit the store and see these improvements.
