HUNTERS' LICENSES.

County Clerk A. L. Hassell has been supplied with hunters' licenses by State Warden W. D. Howser of the Department of Game, Fish and Forestry, Nashville.

Under the game and fish laws, every person who hunts, except on his own land, is required to have a hunter's license. If he is a resident of the State, and desires to hunt only in his own county, then he is required to have county license; if a resident of the State, he is required to have a State license to hunt in another county; a non-resident must have a non-resident license to hunt in Tennessee. A man and his family is allowed to hunt on his own land without a hunter's license.

All Sheriffs, Deputy Sheriffs, Constables, City Marshals and Policemen are constituted ex officio deputy fish and game wardens.

The law prescribes furthermore that "any State warden or deputy warden who shall fail to perform any act, duty or obligation enjoined upon him by the game and fish laws of the State, or to make a faithful attempt so to do, or who shall wilfully disobey the game and fish laws in any detail, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and shall be punished upon conviction, by a fine of not less than fifty nor more than one hundred dollars."

THE HORSE'S PRAYER.
