The Presidential Election—Shall Southern Niggers Decide It? From the La Crosse Democrat.

During the year 1867 the Democracy have carried the following States: Connecticut, California, Kentucky, Delaware, Maryland, New Jersey, New York, Ohio and Pennsylvania. We shall probably carry all these States in 1868 for the Democratic Presidential nominee, with several gains. With proper exertions and organization we can carry Maine, New Hampshire, Indiana, Illinois, Wisconsin, Minnesota and Oregon. But assuming that we should succeed in electing the Democratic electoral tickets only in the States at present held by us, we have the following number of electoral votes.

In 1864 the total number of electoral votes contested in the Presidential election was 221—of these 119 constitutes a majority of seven. From this it will be seen that the Democracy have a majority of the total electoral vote, as radically organized and used in 1864, in the nine States they actually hold at the present moment.

The Radicals are aware of this fact, and are laying plans to checkmate and defeat the really dominant party of the Republic. They propose to vote the eleven excluded States (including Tennessee) as a unit for their nominee, whoever he may be. This accounts for the injustice, rascality and downright frauds perpetrated by them, through the five Rump kings, in the districting of the States held by them so that the negroes and their black hearted Yankee Partisan allies, should control the conventions and secure supremacy in the same—and accounts, also, for the persistency with which the Radicals adhere to the damnable dogma of negro suffrage.

Should the Radicals, as perfect their arrangement, "reconstruct" the States, and conclude to admit them to a participation in the Presidential election of 1868, and (as they certainly would), should the States vote for the Rump nominees, the Radicals would have a total electoral vote of 179, or a majority of 60! Even should we gain Illinois (16), Indiana (13), Maine (7), New Hampshire (3), Wisconsin (10), Minnesota (4), and Oregon (3), we would still have a majority against us of four!

Does this not account for the anxiety manifested by the Rump and its tools, the cowards and rascals doing their dirty work in Virginia, North Carolina, South Carolina, Georgia, Florida, Alabama, Mississippi, Louisiana, Arkansas and Texas? Even should there be a failure to call conventions in any of the States by the negotiating acts of all being the ungrateful States who "electoral" colleges with negro "jurors" cast solidly for Grant or Chase, as the case may be!

The people in every Northern State which has voted have condemned, in the most emphatic manner, the reconstruction policy of the Rump and the infamous idea of negro equality; but disregarding these facts, the Radicals are determined to maintain their hold upon the Federal Government and offices by hauling the negroes of the States lately in revolution solidly against the white majority of the Republic. In the eleven States referred to (including Tennessee) between 400,000 and 600,000 white men are disfranchised, for no other reason than to secure the consummation of the Radical plot against the rights and liberties of the whites of the Union!

Never were desperate, bold and unprincipled men more outspoken and plain of speech! They do not attempt to hide their purposes, they wantonly, brazenly, and infamously declare their designs, boast of their power and ability to carry them out! They ignore the manifest disapproval of their villainy expressed again and again at the North, and audaciously defy Democrats and Conservatives to help themselves! Could anything be plainer than the following clipped from the New York Tribune, of the 16th, in the course of an editorial announcing the determination to adhere to the filthy negro equality idea?

"The Republicans are bound to go under (thank God!) if they don't enfranchise the blacks. Manhood suffrage is not a "side issue" for them, but one of life and death. If the blacks are not enfranchised, Vallandigham could beat Grant for President. If the Southern States were reconstructed on a white basis, he would and could carry all but one of the fifteen free States by overwhelming majorities."

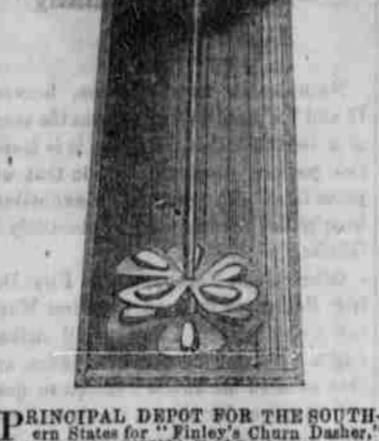
