An Ordinance.

An Ordinance pertaining to Fire Escapes:

Be it Ordained by the City Council of the City of Waco.

Section I. That the owners or lessees of all hotels, boarding houses, tenement houses, factories and store houses over two stories high, and all theatres and opera houses, in the city of Waco, are hereby required to provide the same with good and suitable fire escapes amply sufficient to furnish means of safe egress to all inmates in case of fire.

Sec. II. Hereafter the city engineer shall issue no permits for buildings mentioned in section one of this ordinance unless such fire escapes are provided for in the plans and specifications. It is hereby made unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to hereafter erect any of said buildings in the city of Waco without providing the same with such fire escapes.

Sec. III. That any person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be fined not less than twenty-five (25) dollars or more than two hundred (200) dollars for each offense, and each day's refusal after due notice shall be given, shall be deemed a separate offense.

Sec. IV. That all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with any of the provisions of this ordinance shall and the same is hereby repealed.

Sec. V. That this ordinance take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

Passed February 4, 1892. Approved.
