RIOTS IN ARGENTINE

SAN LUIS SUFFERS FROM SERIOUS RIOTS.

Police in Conflict With Citizens—Several Killed and Wounded—Prominent Politician Shot—Election Frauds Investigation Caused the Trouble.

NEW YORK, Feb. 23.—The Herald's Buenos Ayres special cables: The country continues in a condition of great agitation over the approaching presidential elections. The riots and frauds which disgraced the recent congressional Sunday elections stirred up public indignation which has increased as the investigation into the charges against the officials has proceeded.

At San Luis, the capital of the province of the same name, some 400 miles west of Buenos Ayres, the disturbances were most serious. In a conflict between the police and radicals the former discharged their guns at the crowd. After the firing had ceased it was found that twenty-two civilians had been wounded and two killed. A large number of persons were arrested. They were treated very harshly, not being permitted to communicate with their friends. The wounded, it is alleged, were left unattended for several hours, and many of them were in danger of death. Senor Arias was one of the killed.

Senor Salvador was also shot dead by the police. He was one of the foremost radicals in San Luis and had a large following. His killing aroused a storm of indignation throughout the province.

The frands at San Luis elections are also arousing bitter criticism. The cheating taking place in most all of the departments was in nearly every case accompanied by a row, which resulted in the killing or the wounding of civilians by the police. This was especially the case in the departments of Santa Rosa and Belgrano, where the police fired upon the people.

Luis Saenz Pena now appears certain of election as president of the republic. He is popular with the people and the politicians are rallying to his support. The report that President Pelligrini favors his candidacy is confirmed. A meeting of the committee to select a suitable candidate for president in Buenos Ayres has agreed on Pena for president.

Word was received here of great distress among the farming population of the province of Mendoza. Owing to the locust plague nearly 60 per cent of the vines in the province have been destroyed.

The foreign minister's attention is now engaged upon points relative to the limits of Chile in the boundary question. It is stated that the difficulty between the Argentine limitation commission and Chile arises from a difference of opinion in the interpretation of the treaty fixing the boundary.

Massacred by Indians.

NEW YORK, Feb. 23.—The Herald's La Paz, Bolivia, cablegram of the 21st says: "At Huairo, in the Peruvian department of Ayacucho the Bolivian Indians have attacked a number of farm houses. People took refuge within the doors and sustained a long fight with their enemies. Before the savages had forced an entrance two regiments from Ayacucho, capital of the department arrived and routed the red skins, killing twelve of their number and badly wounding three others. Advances from other parts of the state tell of Indian outbreaks and massacre of a number of missionaries and settlers.

Hill's Great Room.

WASHINGTON, Feb. 23.—Southern members of congress here are watching the development of the Alliance with much interest. Hill has gained strength very rapidly in the south of late and will have not only the solid New York support, but a large share of the southern delegates. The Cleveland people, however, are not idle, and have been stirred up to special activity by Hill's success in New York and the south and are determined to make a hard fight, putting the great northwest against the south and New York state in the convention.
