A GRAND SUCCESS.

Fifteenth Anniversary of McLennan Lodge, I. O. O. F. Celebrated Last Night.

Just fifteen years ago last night McLennan Lodge, No. 241, Independent Order of Odd Fellows was planted in Waco. This celebration of this anniversary was the object of the gathering at their spacious hall last evening—beautifully decorated for the occasion by Messrs. S. V. Pierce, Goode, Best and S. W. Chambers.

The entertainment was opened by an eloquent prayer by Rev. William Wilson De Hart.

The history of McLennan lodge was given by Capt. T. A. Blair which was listened to with much interest, especially by those who were not before familiar with it.

The lodge was organized with only fourteen members, since which time the names of over 500 worthy members have been enrolled, many of whom have passed over the silent river and others moved away.

McLennan lodge has dispensed, since it was first instituted, over \$5,000 to worthy objects of charity, nursed its sick, succored, helped and comforted its distressed, and cared for the widows of deceased members and educated their orphans.

This lodge has the distinguished honor of having furnished three grand masters of the supreme lodge of the state and one delegate to the supreme lodge of the world.

Next on the programme was a vocal solo. "The Cooked Song," by Miss E. Burgess, which was well rendered, showing perfect control of her well trained voice.

The recitation by Miss Laura Yates of Shakespeare's Romeo and Juliet, descriptive of the courtship scene on the balcony, contrasted with courtships of the nineteenth century was simply grand and elicited the wildest applause.

The instrumental solo by Miss Halie Tarver was well executed.

A vocal solo was next well rendered by Mr. John B. Tullis, accompanied by Miss Emma De Zouche. Miss De Zouche was to have delivered a recitation but was forbidden from doing so by her physician on account of hoarseness.

Miss Eva Darrow was also unable to carry out her part of the programme on account of hoarseness.

Mr. J. W. Taylor, next delivered an eloquent address upon the history of the practical work of odd fellowship as seen by an outsider, which was both instructive and edifying.

Miss E. Loyd rendered a difficult but beautiful instrumental solo in a manner which did the fair performer much credit and delighted the audience.

The entertainment closed with singing the long metre doxology.
