Following is the coinage plank in the Minnesota Democratic platform: "We hold, in accordance with a traditional policy of our party, to the use of both gold and silver, and the sole function of the government is to examine the relative value of the metals of coinage as established by the commercial world, and if there has been a sufficient fluctuation in the value of either to make the existing ratio unequal, then to readjust the ratio so that the number of grains of either metal in the unit of coinage, the dollar, shall be equivalent in value, and then to permit the free, unrestricted coinage of both metals."

The St. Louis Republic says this is the clearest and most concise statement of the traditional policy of the Democratic party it has ever seen. THE NEWS regards it as rather misleading in that it presupposes a fluctuation in value of both metals when one of them, gold, is the standard of value and cannot change. The price of silver rises and falls but gold being the standard by which the value of silver is measured its value is always the same. A clearer and more concise statement is this: "We hold that bimetalism is a cordial principle of the Democratic party and there should be no restriction of the coinage of either gold or silver but both should be coined free upon a ratio established by the commercial world."

SOME CLIPPINGS.

The New York Sun in fighting for Tammany Hall and its candidate, Hill, refers to the effort in 1888 to prevent Hill's nomination for governor and particularly to an anti-Hill meeting in September of that year and says:

"Two months later the people of the state by a majority of nearly 20,000, elected Mr. Hill governor, relegating upon the same occasion the Hon. Grover Cleveland to the kindly obscurity of a perfunctory or wholly theoretical practice in William street, causing, in all brevity, his enforced departure from the White House in favor of a Republican successor."

That is why New York should not be permitted to dictate the candidate of the Democratic party.

The Dallas Times-Herald says: "It has been the rule to elect a governor of Texas for the second term, and the outlook now is that this year will not bring an exception to the rule. Hogg is unpopular with some people, but has lost none of his strength with the great majority."

It has been the rule in Texas since 1873 for the Democratic governors to conduct the office in accordance with Democratic principles. There having been an exception to this rule during the last two years the Democrats of Texas propose to elect a man who will return to it. No governor is entitled to a second term by reason of precedence in party action, but that and the commission which has already been adopted and incorporated in the constitution constitute the only claim set forth by the friends of Governor Hogg as reasons for his re-election.


