Language of Precious Stones.
The superstition that each month of the year has a gem associated with it, and that the influence of qualities attributed to different gems controls the destinies of persons born in the various months, is taken from the folk lore of Poland. According to this superstition January has a jacinth or garnet, which denotes constancy and fidelity. February—amethyst, preventive against violent passions. March—a blood stone, courage and wisdom. April—sapphire or diamond, signifying repentance and innocence. May—emerald, typical of successful love. June—an agate, meaning long life and health. July—ruby, corrects evils resulting from mistaken friendship. August—sardonyx, a happy married life. September—chrysolite, preserves from folly. October—opal, denotes both misfortune and hope. November—topaz, prevents bad dreams, denotes hope and sharpens the sight and faith of the possessor. December—turquoise, signifies prosperity in love.

How Virginia Got Its Nickname.
Inter-Ocean tells that the authorities in the colony of Virginia, at the time of the contest in England between the Stuarts and Cromwell, appear to have been devoted to the Stuarts, and when the Cromwellian government threatened to send a fleet to reduce the colony to submission its officials dispatched a message to young Charles, who was afterward king of England under the title of Charles II, who was then hiding in France, to come over and be king of Virginia. It is said that Charles was on the point of starting, when the collapse of the commonwealth and the Cromwellian regime took place, which sent him to the English throne. Charles never forgot this devotion of Virginia to his fortunes, and that colony was subsequently classed with England, Scotland and Ireland as leading members of the empire. In this way Virginia came to be known among the American colonies as the Old Dominion.


