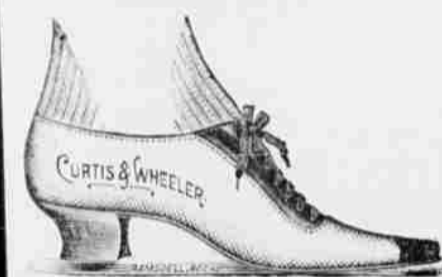

Who was the hero of the hour, who was it that plunged himself into this solid flame to rescue human life heedless of his own with not even a meagre chance to escape destruction. Who was this noble patriot? It was poor Al Hayne, the fireman. He well knew the material of that structure, he well knew the power of combustion, he knew the element of fire, but he was a fireman and knew no limit to his duty; he gave up his life for others, and his name will travel in the memory of Texas firemen when those of Bonaparte and Wellington will fade in oblivion.

Mr. Littlepage next delivered a short address eulogistic of President Levy, which was applauded to the echo.

President Levy then took the chair and requested the committee on credentials to occupy the rostrum and prepare its report as soon as possible.

Mr. J. W. Littlefield was appointed sergeant-at-arms and after other preliminary work the convention adjourned till 2 o'clock p. m.

### SECOND DAY'S PROCEEDINGS OF THE ASSOCIATION.

Secretary J. Mayers Connor's Report of Committees—Election of Officers this Afternoon—Professor Whelpley's Address.

President Kiltayer called the Pharmaceutical Association to order for the second days business this morning at 9:30.

The first order of business for the day was the reports of the secretary, treasurer and medical association.

Secretary L. Myers Connor's report was especially interesting and is here given in full.

To the Texas State Pharmaceutical Association:

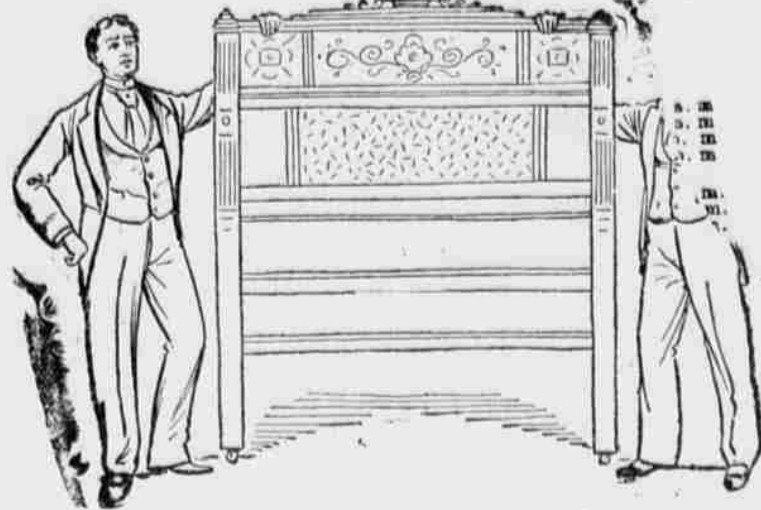
Gentlemen—It is with pleasure that I present you my third annual report, as there has been a great deal of interest manifested by the members, and it is my honest opinion that had not we been afflicted with financial depression, three hundred pharmacists would have gathered at this convention. Conclusions are drawn from the fact that numerous inquiries have been made concerning our association, and greater publicity has been given than heretofore by the widespread circulation of our announcement containing the prize feature, which seems to have stimulated and encouraged that portion of the profession which greatly enriches and intensifies the interest of pharmaceutical conventions.

The next thing to attribute to the the association's improved tendency, is the prompt manner and marked attention given to the treasury department, for hitherto no complaints have reached me concerning certificates and other matters from that source, which have heretofore greatly annoyed both members and officials.

It has been my purpose and privilege in previous reports to suggest any new feature to the association for its betterment, and as this time I have this offer: That the association pay to members \$5, \$10 and \$25 for the best collection of indigenous drugs found in his locality with full description of the probable quantity of same, such samples to be placed upon a table in the convention hall for the benefit of members. And it may further create a new industry in the gathering and garbling for eastern markets, as there are many drugs which have a vigorous and prolific growth in our state, which are in daily demand.

I would further suggest in this connection that a gold medal be awarded for the best display of chemical and pharmaceutical products, in order that we may encourage more extensive and elaborate displays, which adds so much to the interests of our meeting and brings about a close relationship between the manufacturer and dealer; and it would be well to establish a permanent committee on exhibits, and they to make written requests for dis-
