A VOICE FROM BELL

Where Mr. Pendleton's Support Comes from.

THIRD PARTY WANT HIM OR BLAKE

Nominated Because Either of Them would be Easy to Beat—A Letter from an Intelligent Citizen of Holland Describing the Situation in Bell County—Gerald the Man

THE NEWS received a letter last Saturday from a gentleman in Holland; Bell county, giving a report of Gerald's speech there and a general review of the situation. THE NEWS did not intend to publish the letter for several reasons, but Mr. Blake's unfair treatment of Judge Gerald Saturday, and Mr. Pendleton's effort to jayhawk the Marlin delegation, calls for a defense of McLennan county's candidate, and THE NEWS wishes to be understood as being ready at all times to fight for McLennan county and her candidates. The letter is as follows:

HOLLAND, May 13.—Judge Gerald, candidate for congress, to fill the unexpired term of Mills, addressed the citizens of Holland last night. It was his first visit to this place, and he was known only from reputation, except to a few parties. His speech was well received and he won the respect of all parties. He is a man of convictions, aggressive in thought, with the candor that comes of an honest heart and intellect. His speech was well put and was well received, and the Third Party men candidly admit that he is the most formidable candidate that is in the field. He is in favor of the free coinage of silver, and for the purpose of increasing our circulation, while Lieutenant-Governor Pendleton said "that the government had no right to inflate the currency of the country, but that he was in favor of "Free Coinage." The lieutenant governor also said that he did not understand the "Silver Question." Everyone who knows the gentleman will indorse the last statement. Also he says the way out of these trouble, "is to sell higher and buy cheaper"

It is refreshing to listen to a man like Judge Gerald, who has clear-cut ideas, is brave and candid, after enduring the silly rot of our "razor-back" politicians, who have fatigued indignation and contempt with their utter stupidity. The third party men have met our Bell county politicians and have literally mopped the earth with them, and the public are concluding that Democracy has no defense to offer. \*\*\* It is probable that Bell county will instruct for Judge Gerald, and unless the "muggies" capture the primaries it will be sure to do so.

For four years Bell county has been in a turmoil and the muggies have beaten the regular nominees. Two years ago Lieut. Gov. Pendleton denounced the nomination of the regular—H. P. Robertson—as a fraud, yet was nominated by the same convention, or indorsed by it for lieutenant-governor. He said that he would have supported Robertson, but that his nomination was a "fraud," and he lent all his prestige to defeat Robertson; and Mr. Pendleton's only hope of an endorsement of his own county is now based on the possibility of the "muggies" capturing the primaries, and de-

feating the regular Democracy of Bell county. He has done more by his course and expressions than any other man in Bell county to destroy the organized machinery of the Democratic party. The Third party here are anxious that Pendleton or Blake will be the nominee of the Democratic party, they expect to be able to beat either of them.

Blake's expressed views on the "Financial Question," render his election impossible; the Third party men have met and scalped Mr. Pendleton until there is nothing left for the political barber but to shellac the knots and putty up the holes, and it is suspected that an attempt will be made at enough of the primaries in Bell county by the Third party men to have Bell county instruct for Pendleton, hat is their first step, and if they can have him or Blake nominated they expect to go in "flying."

Now the Democratic party would as well look to it at once, that we have a fight on hand.

It took the prestige of Mills to hold this district heretofore, and now the Third party is vastly stronger and more alert, and it is prudence and truth to tell the district that Pendleton can not command a united support of the Democratic party in Bell county, to say nothing of the Third party that will vote all the Republicans nearly to a man.

This is all plain, but when a man concludes that he runs the party, but at the same time is devoured by every man that he meets on the rostrum, it is time to call a halt and get a better man.
