AN ORDINANCE.

An Ordinance to Amend Article 584 of the Digest of City Ordinances of the City of Waco.

Be it ordained by the city council of the city of Waco:

Section 1. That article 584 of the Digest of the city ordinances of the city of Waco shall be so amended as to read as follows: Whoever in this city shall on Sunday sell, offer for sale, give away, or in any other manner dispose of any spirituous, vinous, or other intoxicating liquors, or shall keep open the doors of any barroom, saloon, or other house or place where any such liquors are kept or sold, or shall play at any game of billiards, pool, bagatelle, jenny lind, pigeon hole, base ball or any other game of chance, at which anything of value is lost or won, or shall be engaged in running any horse race, or shall engage in match shooting, or shall discharge any fire arms at or in any gun shop or shooting gallery, or shall on Sunday march in any procession, or otherwise, with music, through the streets or other public places, or shall play on any musical instrument in any public place so as to disturb the peace and quiet of others, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof shall be fined in any sum not less than twenty nor more than fifty dollars; provided, that so much of this article as refers to processions and music shall not apply to funeral processions nor to cases where the mayor shall have given written permission.

Sec. 2. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

Passed October 15, 1891. Note—The foregoing ordinance, not having been signed by the mayor nor returned to the council with his objections thereto within three days after its passage, thereupon became a law without his signature.
