## STATE NEWS.

—Cattlemen are holding their cattle for better prices.

—Colorado, Mitchell county, is putting in an ice factory.

—A large number of residences are going up at Clarendon.

—There has been six murders committed in Dallas during the year 1891.

—A case of confluent smallpox has been developed near New Braunfels.

—The new Chestnut street block in Abilene will be built of brick and cost \$7642.

—Contracts for several fine buildings will probably be let in Palestine immediately.

—Gertrude Kirchner jumped from a street car at San Antonio Monday and broke her leg.

—Adolph Pari suicided near Corpus Christi by shooting himself with a shot-gun recently.

—Eastland county has under consideration the construction of three or four bridges in the county.

—Dink Davis, of Weatherford, who was shot last week by Prof. Moore, at Poolville, died Monday.

—A fire at Seymour Sunday night destroyed a block of frame buildings. Loss \$7000, insurance \$5000.

—Terrell has leased her water works to the Terrell ice light and water company for a period 30 years.

—Bob Jenkins and his father-in-law Henry F. Chambers were found killed about fourteen miles from Bastrop Monday.

—Bastrop is going to have an artesian well for a water supply. The new brick blocks there are rapidly nearing completion.

—Ed Scott and W. B. Anson two men who burglarized the gun store of Hummell & Son at San Antonio have been arrested.

—Ella Harris took an ounce of landamm at Sulpher Springs Monday and came near dying. She thought that just a dose.

—Two men have been arrested at Clarendon who are thought to be Meiton and Dunlap the murderers of S. D. McClellan of Waco.

—Patrick Kelly tried to commit suicide in Houston Monday by cutting his throat but made a failure, though he made two bad wounds.

—H. T. Hunter was struck on the head with a piece of buggy shaft at Dallas Sunday by James Lewis from the effects of which he died Monday.

—Charlie Johnson was killed Sunday morning at Texarkana while switching cars. He fell and the wheels of two cars run over both legs just below the knee.

—The Hartley town company has contract for a complete system of waterworks with two miles of mains. Work will begin at once, the engine and machinery having already been ordered.

—J. S. Morris who recently broke guard has been captured near Quanah. While searching for him John Freeman and Will Hill, wanted in Montague county for horse stealing were captured.

—Ft. Worth is protesting against other towns sending their cases of smallpox there because she takes good care of them. They claim to have been imposed on this way five times this season.

—A firm in Waco which failed a short time since owed a New Orleans firm a considerable amount. They sent H. N. McElroy there to make a settlement. He arranged to get \$1750 of the amount, and then cowed J. H. Solomon of the defunct firm, for which he was arrested. He wired his house that he collected \$1750 and cowed Solomon for the balance.

In the April number of The Forum, Representative R. Q. Mills, of Texas, will make a critical analysis of the census, to show that it is so seriously defective as to be useless. In the same number of The Forum, Senator Hoar, of Massachusetts, who was the champion of the Election Bill in the Senate, constructs an argument to prove that the Republican party was untrue to its precedents and to its principles, because the late Congress adjourned without enacting the Election Bill. He argues that the series of great historical achievements of the Republican party suffered so serious a breach by this inactivity, that they must find new vigor to make its future in any way worthy of its past.

It has just been reported to her that her husband died February 2nd and was buried in the asylum grave yard. She now goes to Terrell to learn why she was kept in ignorance of his death for nearly two months. The matter has been telegraphed to Gov. Hogg.
