Mission Postoffice To Second Class

(Special to The Herald.)
MISSION, Tex., May 21.—Announcement is made that the local postoffice has been made a second class one, the receipts for the past year having reached the required amount. I. J. Wright, postmaster, in a statement issued yesterday, says that the office has reached the second class from the patronage of local people and not from any abnormal source, such as large encampments of troops. Mr. Wright says further that the receipts are holding good and that the present year will show a much larger increase over the past year. On the showing made, Senator Sheppard has introduced a bill in the senate asking for a \$50,000 federal building for this place.

Corpus Christi Will Can Its Sea Foods

(By Associated Press.)
CORPUS CHRISTI, Tex., May 21.—Conservation of the surplus vegetable crop of Nueces County, and the canning of shrimp, oysters and seafoods caught in Corpus Christi bay and other coastal waters, now is assured as a result of an agreement with the city whereby the Corpus Christi Fishing and Packing Company has begun the erection of a big canning plant. The company which has a paid-up capital stock of \$20,000 has leased city property having a depth of 400 feet and is 56 feet wide. The entire plot will be covered by a sheet iron building and machinery for canning purposes installed. It is planned to begin operations about July 1. An unusual number of home gardens this summer is expected to result in a surplus supply which will be diverted to the new canning factory.
