

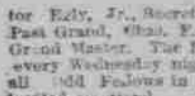

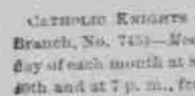

### A FLAG OF TURCE.

Edhem Pasha Wants an Armistice for Five Days.

London, May 3.—A dispatch from Athens announces that Edhem Pasha has sent an officer with a flag of truce to Greek headquarters, asking for an armistice for five days. An other dispatch from Athens says it is also reported that Bulgarian irregulars, to the number of about 200 men, have crossed the frontier in Macedonia.

### COLONEL VASSOS RECALLED.

Athens, May 3.—The Greek Government has recalled Colonel Vassos from Crete. He will be replaced in command of the Greek forces on the island by Colonel Stafkos.

### Casea, May 3

There are renewed reports here today that the Greek troops are about to be withdrawn from the island of Crete.

### Candia, May 3

The admirals commanding the fleets of the foreign powers, in Cretan waters had a conference yesterday with the insurgent leaders at Paleokastro. The Cretans were promised complete autonomy, including the condition that the nomination of their ruler should be subject to the ratification of the Cretan assembly.  
 The insurgent leaders, however, cut short the conversation and reiterated that their motto remained, "Annexation to Greece or Death."

### GREEK FLEET IN POSITION.

London, May 3.—The Standard's correspondent at Volo will say tomorrow:

The Greek fleet is taking position to shell the heights of the defile leading to Macriotiza in case the Turks succeed in turning the Greek flank and marching to Volo. The foreign warships have moved further out, leaving the Greek fleet free range. The Greek fleet has sent four heavy guns to Velestino.

### NICARAGUA BOUNDARY DISPUTE.

New York, May 3.—A dispatch to the Herald from Panama says: A correspondent in Costa Rica telegraphs that the government is preparing to send immediately 2000 men to the Nicaraguan frontier, pending a decision of the boundary dispute. It is said that President Zelaya of Nicaragua now has several hundred troops, 400 are scattered in small groups between the frontier towns. In San Juan there are 150 men waiting orders, 200 more in Chinanadega, 200 in Leon and a like number in Granada. Rivas has also been strengthened by several hundred soldiers. All this activity may or may not result in hostilities. Nicaragua in her action is dominated by a fear that there will be

### an invasion as government officials have received private

stating that a movement of that kind is being pushed forward. The leaders, it is said, are men who have been exiled from Nicaragua. Costa Rica, on the other hand, in view of the present strained relations with Nicaragua, is merely sending her troops to the front, so that if here is any trouble there will be no delay in strengthening her defenses. The commission which now has the boundary dispute under consideration is composed of three engineers, one appointed by Nicaragua, one by Costa Rica and a third commissioner, E. P. Alexander of South Carolina, who was appointed by President Cleveland.

### THEIR HINDOO GUEST.

San Francisco, Cal., May 3.—A Hindoo calling himself the Bramcharin Bobhabiskshu, nearly created a riot at the meeting of the Woman's Congress by denouncing the women of the West as savages and declaring that he had been insulted.  
 The gathering of women from all over the State has been in session here all the week. The Bramcharin Bobhabiskshu has been a picturesque figure, always attired in a flowing gown of silk and wearing a huge turban. The women have made much of the man from India, who has posed as an example of humility and gentleness, and last night he was invited to speak on the subject of religion as a synonym of education.
