**ARMISTICE SENTENCE**  
**ASKED FOR AFFIRMED**

MADRIZ AND ESTRADA ASKED TO SUSPEND HOSTILITIES FOR EIGHT DAYS, PENDING EFFORTS TO RESTORE PEACE.

(Herald Special.) Bluefields, Nicaragua, May 3.—The Central American Court of Justice at Cartago today appealed to Estrada and Madriz to declare armistice for eight days, during which time the court will be acting as a mediator and endeavor to restore peace in the country. The move is the result of a decision on the part of the American republics to end the war which has been so disastrous to the commerce of Nicaragua and which has damaged the business interests of other neighboring countries.

Knox Is Pleased.

(Herald Special.) Washington, D. C., May 3.—When Secretary of State Knox heard of the proposed armistice in Nicaragua, he cabled a congratulatory message to the international court at Cartago, intimating that such a proceeding is highly satisfactory to the United States.

**TEDDY TAKING IT EASY**

Has a Quiet Time in Country Visits Places of Interest About the City.

(Herald Special.) The president is here today, and is taking things by easy stages, having slowed down on the strenuous entertainment programs. This morning he visited one of the model dairy farms near the city and was much interested. Later he visited the Roskilde cathedral, where he placed wreaths on the tombs of the late King Christian and Princess Marie, and visited the castle at Fredericksburg and the national art gallery. This afternoon he went to Elsinore, the supposed scene of Shakespeare's Hamlet. The party leaves tonight for Christiana, arriving there tomorrow morning.

**MYSTERY IN GRAFT CASE**

States Attorney Wayman Disappears From Chicago—Grand Jury Has Adjourned.

(Herald Special.) Chicago, May 3.—A mystery developed today in the sensational graft case. States Attorney Wayman has disappeared and left no trace of his whereabouts or of the motive that prompted him to leave the city and the grand jury at this time. The grand jury has adjourned until tomorrow morning. There are many rumors regarding his disappearance. One is that he has gone to get the confession of another representative, and another says that he has gone to Springfield to confer with Prosecutor Burke, who is accused of trying to hamper the investigation of the White charges that he received one thousand dollars to vote for Senator Lorimer.

**THIRD AVIATION PURSE**

(Herald Special.) London, May 3.—The third \$50,000 aviation prize offered by the London Daily Mail was announced today, and is offered for a successful flight from London to Paris.

FINE OF TWENTY THOUSAND DOLLARS AGAINST STANDARD OIL CO. AFFIRMED BY UNITED STATES COURT OF APPEALS.

(Herald Special.) New York, May 3.—The judgment of guilty of violating the Elkins anti-robbery law and the fine of twenty thousand dollars imposed on the Standard Oil company by the United States district court of Buffalo, was affirmed by the United States circuit court of appeals here today. The Standard was found guilty of accepting rebates from the published tariffs on petroleum shipments from Olean, N. Y., to Rutland, Virginia.

**METHODISTS GATHERING**

General Conference of the Methodist Church, South, Begins in Nashville, N. C., Tomorrow.

(Herald Special.) Nashville, N. C., May 3.—During the next few weeks beginning tomorrow the Methodist church is to have the honor of entertaining the quadrennial general conference of the Methodist Episcopal church, the meeting being the largest ever held by that body in North America. It will be the sixteenth annual session of the general conference, and from present indications is likely to be one of the largest.

Over one thousand delegates and visitors have already arrived in Asheville to attend the gathering and it is expected the number will be more than doubled before the end of the week. From St. Louis, Louisville, Memphis, Baltimore, Birmingham, Atlanta, Jacksonville, New Orleans and from the chief cities of Texas special trains are arriving almost hourly with large delegations.

The choice of new bishops is the staple topic of discussion among the delegates now in the city. Six members of the episcopacy have passed away since the last quadrennial conference, so that it will be necessary to elect at least that number of new bishops. This number may be increased if it is decided to superannuate several of the present bishops on account of age.

Dr. C. W. Byrd of Dallas, editor of the Texas Christian Advocate, is mentioned as one of the possible choices of the conference.

**WERE MARRIED TODAY**

Ruth Bryan Leavitt Married to Lieutenant Reginald Altham Owen at the Bryan Home.

(Herald Special.) Lincoln, Neb., May 3.—The wedding of Lieutenant Reginald Altham Owen of the British Royal Engineers, and Ruth Bryan Leavitt was celebrated at Fairview, the Bryan country home, today. Strict censorship on the part of the Bryans prevented any announcement of the details of the wedding until the couple were aboard the train and off on their honeymoon trip. It is believed they will go to Kingston, Jamaica, where the lieutenant served in the British army. The route, however, will be kept a secret because of the desire to avoid Leavitt, the divorced husband.

**FIGHT IN DOUBT.**

Johnson Tells a Friend to Keep His Mouth Shut—May Be No Fight.

(Herald Special.) Chicago, May 3.—Consternation prevails in sporting circles here today as the result of a telegram received by a friend from Jack Johnson advising against betting on the Jeffries-Johnson fight, saying that there may be no fight, because of the death of Tommy McCarthy. Feeling in San Francisco is high against allowing the fight to take place there if planned.
