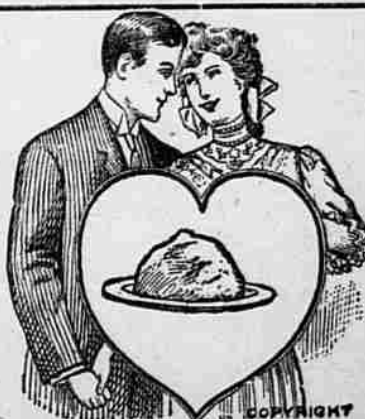

**ROOSEVELT STIRS THEM**

ing the address of the City Corporation. A brief reply by Mr. Roosevelt, acknowledging the cordial reception afforded him by the inhabitants of London, concluded the formal ceremonies. Later the former president and the members of his family were given an opportunity to meet the officials of the City of London and numerous other persons of distinction who attended the reception.

In response to the speech making him an honorary freeman of the city, Roosevelt assailed England's administration of Egypt and declared that England should rule with a stronger hand or get out. The boldness of the statement astonished the distinguished audience, and will undoubtedly stir

up a big row. The views expressed by Roosevelt

with the opposition to the government but it is probable the opposition will object to such caustic criticism coming from an outsider. Although frequently applauded, there was a lack of enthusiasm over the American's address. The audience was perplexed by the unexpected situation that has developed.

Roosevelt lauded the work of the British government in Africa and elsewhere except in Egypt. He said: "In Egypt you are guardians of your own interests and the interests of civilization and the present conditions of affairs there are a menace to your empire. If you feel that you should not be in Egypt and have no desire to keep order there, then by all means you should get out. But if you feel it your duty to stay there, then by all means show yourselves ready to meet the responsibilities of the position."
