## WOMEN FOUGHT

AND ALMOST MOBBED A DOZEN ST. LOUIS POLICEMEN IN EFFORTS TO GAIN ADMISSION TO THE DOXEY TRIAL.

St. Louis, Mo., June 2.—Women fought with one another and pulled hair, and almost mobbed a dozen policemen today in a wild scramble to gain admittance to the court room to hear the trial of Mrs. Dora Doxey, charged with murdering William Erder, to whom she was married while the wife of another man. The police were compelled to use harsh measures to control the crowd. It is known that Mrs. Doxey will admit that she married Erder while still the wife of Dr. Doxey. Mrs. Doxey has already received an offer of \$250 per week to go on the stage in case she is acquitted by the jury.

Mrs. Doxey told a pitifully dramatic story on the witness stand. She claimed to be influenced by the use of morphine and a slave to Dr. Doxey and these things led her to the bar on the charge of murder. She denied that she poisoned Erder.

## ALL FIGHTS ARE FAKES

## GROWERS ROBBED

BY THE SUGAR TRUST, AS WELL AS GOVERNMENT, ACCORDING TO TESTIMONY GIVEN TODAY BY ERNEST GERBRACHT.

New York, June 2.—That the sugar trust is founded on fraud by which not only the government but the growers of sugar have suffered, is the deduction from the testimony of Ernest Gerbracht, an ex-superintendent of the Williamsburg refinery given in today's trial of the sugar trust to defeat the government of custom duties. Gerbracht testified that he was ordered by H. O. Havemeyer to falsify the polariscopic tests on sugar so that the company would have to pay less to the sugar growers. That the trust robbed the men with whom it did business is a new development in the trial.
