## PITTHAM ESCAPED

CABLES FROM PORT LIMON SAY AMERICAN HAS PROBABLY ESCAPED FROM THE MADRIZ FORCES IN NICARAGUA.

 New Orleans, La., June 6.—Cables received here today from Port Limon express doubts as to whether or not William Pittham, the American with the Estrada forces in Nicaragua, has ever been captured by the Madriz forces. A story is also afloat that Pittham was taken prisoner, but later escaped. It is now believed that Zelaya is financing the Madriz campaign. Madriz refuses to listen to the proposal from Estrada to allow the United States to mediate the trouble in Nicaragua.
