TWELVE BURNED

FOREIGN WORKMEN LOST THEIR LIVES IN FIRE WHICH DESTROYED THEIR ROOMING HOUSE. THREE FATALLY INJURED.

Niagara Falls, N. Y., June 15.—Twelve foreigners, workmen employed by the Canadian Power Development company, were burned to death this morning in a fire which destroyed a boarding house at Fallsview, Ontario. The origin of the fire is a mystery. Three others, a man and woman and child, are in the hospital suffering from fatal burns. The dead are all Australians.

AVIATOR HAS TROUBLE

Mars Landed the Third Time Near Lawrence in His Flight From Topeka to Kansas City.

Topeka, Kas., June 15.—J. C. Mars, driving the Curtiss biplane "Skylark," left Topeka at 5:10 this morning for a flight to Kansas City. After flying ten minutes he landed at a farm house to get a fresh start. On his second attempt he reached Newman, a town fourteen miles east of here, where he again descended on account of motor trouble.

The engines were working badly, but Mars resumed his flight and landed for the third time at Midland, near Lawrence, at 8:30. He covered the distance from Newman to Midland in twenty-four minutes. In landing at Midland the machine struck the ground hard, and some time was lost in making repairs. Kansas City is sixty-one miles from Topeka.

Mars has been held at Midland indefinitely. High winds and the bad condition of his engines may make it necessary to abandon the flight. If he completes the trip he will win a purse of \$5,000.

WATCH AMERICAN PORTS

Believed That Porter Charlton Has Sailed For America, After Murdering His Wife.

Como, Italy, June 15.—The police are today convinced that Porter Charlton, the husband, murdered Mary Scott Charlton and then sailed for New York. They have notified all vessels bound for America by wireless to keep a look-out for the missing man. This opinion is in direct opposition to United States Ambassador Leishman, who is still convinced that Charlton was slain. The discovery that Charlton's trunk is missing, he claims, strengthens the evidence of his murder. The postmaster at Moltrasio says Charlton asked him about the sailing time of vessels, and also inquired as to the depth of Lake Como. The police are convinced that Charlton has left the country.

WARRIORS MAKE PRESIDENTS.

Secretary of War Dickinson Addresses West Point Graduates.

West Point, N. Y., June 15.—In an address to the graduates of West Point today Secretary of War Dickinson held up Roosevelt as the president whom the fortunes of war had boosted into the White House. AMERICAN DIPLOMACY

WAS SOUNDED IN AN ADDRESS BY HON. PHILANDER KNOX AT COMMENCEMENT OF THE UNIVERSITY OF PENNSYLVANIA.

Philadelphia, Pa., June 15.—Hon. Philander C. Knox sounded the keynote as to American diplomacy under the present administration in a speech delivered at the commencement exercises of the University of Pennsylvania today. In concluding his address Mr. Knox used the following language:

"I have sought to show by this review how uniformly and consistently the motives and results of our international action have tended to advance the brotherhood of nations. We have indeed, as is right, firmly maintained our national sovereignty and dignity and the rights of our citizens, and we have not avoided war when honor and duty have invoked that stern arbitrament. Nevertheless we have loyally submitted ourselves to the control of the ideals of peace and to the principles of international comity and good will; and we have exerted our influence and good offices to guide and aid others along that path. We have not, indeed, stood alone in this attitude, but have acted in concert with other powers who recognize the same high call and seek the same great ends. From the ages when barbarism and cruelty dominated the world, through the intervening eras when advancing civilization slowly extended to relations between states the forces of enlightened and beneficent private enterprise we have reached a point when it is evident that the future holds in store a time when wars shall cease; when the nations of the world shall realize a federation as real and vital as that now subsisting between the component parts of a single state; when by deliberate international conjunction the strong shall universally help the weak, and when the corporate righteousness of the world shall compel unrighteousness to disappear and shall destroy the habitations of cruelty still lingering in the dark places of the earth. This is 'the spirit of the wide world brooding on things to come.' That day will be the millenium, of course; but in some sense and degree it will surely be realized in this dispensation of mortal time.

"It is for this country always to maintain its historic policy and attitude, to be true to this greatest duty of a nation, which is entirely consistent with all its internal duties, to advance that time which the whole course of history and all divine prophecies and revelations alike presage.

"The tumult and the shouting dies, the captains and the kings depart; let us invoke that solemn prayer of the poet 'lest we forget' that the ancient sacrifice still remains—the sacrifice of the submission to the Almighty of the hearts of a people resolute for righteousness. Thus we shall realize in some sort ourselves and shall help the world and the future to realize that 'far-off divine event to which the whole creation moves.'"

VICTIM OF A BIG PLOT

Will Be Line of Representative Browne's Defense in the Lorimer Bribery Scandal Case.

Chicago, June 15.—The defense of Lee O'Neil Browne will be that he and Senator Lorimer are the victims of a gigantic plot of which Representative White is the tool. Lorimer will probably take the stand and testify along this line. The policy of the defense was indicated today in the cross examination of White. Attorney Forest asked White why he had picked the Tribune to sell his graft story to, and if it was not because the Tribune was hostile to Lorimer and Browne.


White related his first meeting with Browne in Springfield, and said Browne then offered him one thousand dollars for his vote for Lorimer.
