

DEMOCRATS IN SESSION

Pennsylvania State Convention at Allentown—Maine Leaders Entertained By Augusta.

(Herald Special.) Allentown, Pa., June 15.—The democratic state convention convened in this city today and was called to order in the Lyric Theater shortly before noon. Candidates are to be named for governor, lieutenant governor, secretary of internal affairs and treasurer. The democrats believe they have an exceptional opportunity this year and as a consequence spirited contests are on for the various places on the state ticket, particularly the gubernatorial nomination, for which there are four or five aspirants.

Maine Democratic Convention. (Herald Special.) Augusta, Me., June 15.—The democratic state convention of Maine met today to name candidates for governor and other officials to be voted for at the coming state election. Two candidates are seeking the gubernatorial nomination, O. Gardner of Rockwall and Frederick W. Plalsted, the present mayor of Augusta. The platform in addition to local issues will devote considerable attention to national questions, dwelling principally upon the high cost of living and alleged republican extravagances.

OIL COMPANY CASE HEARD

Waters Pierce Oil Company Charged With Violation of Anti-Monopoly Laws In Oklahoma.

(Herald Special.) Enid, Okla., June 15.—The state's suit against the Waters Pierce Oil company for alleged violation of the anti-monopoly laws was called for a hearing in the Garfield county district court today, having been postponed on May 24, owing to the serious illness with typhoid fever of Clay Arthur Pierce, president of the company for the last five years, and a material witness for the defense. The state is ready for the hearing, which will probably consume several weeks. It will try to prove that the defendant company controlled the oil business in the state under an agreement with the Standard Oil company and that this understanding is in violation of the laws.
