## PAPERS ARE FILED TODAY BORAH IS AGGRESSIVE

IN MISSOURI SUPREME COURT AGAINST THE BEEF TRUST TO OUST IT FROM THE STATE AND CONFISCATE PROPERTY.

Jefferson City, Mo., June 20.—Quo warrant proceedings seeking to oust the "beef trust" from Missouri were filed in the state supreme court today by Attorney General Major. It is alleged in the petition that the companies named and others organized the National Packing company for the purpose of controlling the packing business of the country, and asks that the companies forfeit their charters and the property be confiscated or fines be assessed against the companies.

Two separate suits were filed. One of them is directly against the Swift, Morris and Armour packeries, and the other is against the Hammond St. Louis company. Attorney General Major said today that the evidence taken at the hearings in April showed the Hammond St. Louis company to be a subsidiary to the National Packing company, the stock of which is controlled by Swift, Morris and Armour, and though they were separate corporations the one was used in controlling the purchase price of live stock, and the other in the selling price of the dressed products. The defendants were given until June 30th to answer.

WHO SENATOR THINKS WESTERN PEOPLE KNOW BEST ABOUT CONSERVATION NEEDS IN THE WEST.

He characterized such legislation as more than a crime and denounced the system making a homesteader acquire his land.

The mayor said he was not proposing an innovation in the science of municipal reform or setting a precedent, but that he believed his action in Brocker's case would prove a measure of public economy.

Brocker had given to the postoffice instructions to deliver his mail regularly at the county jail.
