LORIMER IS ANGRY

BECAUSE REPRESENTATIVE LEE O'NEIL BROWNE WOULD NOT PERMIT HIM TO TESTIFY AT HIS TRIAL IN CHICAGO.

Chicago, Ill., June 22.—States Attorney Wyman concluded his argument in the trial of Lee O'Neil Browne this morning, after pointing out the circumstances which he declared corroborated Representative White's story. Attorney Erbstein opened for the defense. Senator Lorimer and Browne are said to have had trouble because he wouldn't allow his evidence regarding a political plot to be introduced as defense. Browne refused to take the chance. Lorimer wanted to testify.

MADERO IS TRANSFERRED

Conditions Are Most Grave In Mexico, and Efforts Are Making to Avert Trouble.

Monterey, N. L., Mex., June 22.—Sr. Lic. Francisco Madero, the liberal candidate for president of Mexico, is in the penitentiary at San Luis Potosi, charged with an attempt to lead the rebellion against the government. He was transferred from prison here, where he was confined for several weeks, following his announcement that he would offer for the presidency in opposition to Diaz. He was transferred because of the danger of coming from the frontier. The charge that the indictment was made as a last step by Diaz in his plans to remove his opponent. It is said revolutionary preparations are spreading in the interior. Extra soldiers have been dispatched to the border towns.

IN VIGOROUS LANGUAGE

Roosevelt Denies Rumor That His Daughter Ethel Is to Marry James T. Williams.

New York, N. Y., June 22.—Roosevelt made a record trip in an auto this morning from Oyster Bay to his office in New York. Roosevelt declared he hadn't taken into consideration any political conditions since he returned home to speak of. He denied the report that his daughter Ethel would probably marry James T. Williams, and angrily said: "It is such scandalous infamy that it is foolish to deny it; the report was started by some scoundrel."

Before leaving home this morning Roosevelt laid out a tennis court on the lawn at Sagamore Hill, and the house guests of the colonel will have to play the game.

WOMAN SCORES AT YALE

She is the First of Her Sex to Be Honored With the Degree of Master of Arts.

New Haven, Conn., June 22.—The first woman to be honored by Yale received the degree of master of arts at the 209th commencement today. Jane Addams of Chicago is the recipient of the honor. James J. Hill of the Great Northern railroad was made doctor of laws. The John Addison Porter prize of \$450 was won by William Smith Culbertson of Emporia, Kas., with an essay on Alexander Hamilton.

Appeal Made to Campbell.

New Orleans, June 21.—The insurance interests which have been fighting the insurance rating bill that has already passed the Louisiana house of representatives are going to appeal to Governor Campbell of Texas to help them. They will ask him to send a detailed statement of his reasons for calling a special session of the Texas legislature to repeal the Texas rating law.

NAVIGATE THE AIR

WORLD'S FIRST AERIAL PASSENGER SERVICE WAS INAUGURATED TODAY IN GERMANY—ZEPPELIN IS SUCCESSFUL.

Frederichshafen, Germany, June 22.—The world's first aerial passenger service was inaugurated today, when a cruise was made by the Zeppelin dirigible "Deutschland," Count Zeppelin commanding, with ten passengers, to Dusseldorf, 280 miles. It required ten hours to make the trip. This inaugurates a regular service.

MONEY FOR TEXAS BUILDINGS.

Senate Accepts Items With Only a Few Changes.

Washington, June 21.—The Texas items in the omnibus public building bill were accepted by the senate with the following exceptions:

Appropriation for Marshall reduced from \$65,000 to \$60,000; Weatherford reduced from \$65,000 to \$60,000; appropriation for Ennis advanced from \$50,000 to \$60,000. New items were added to the bill as follows: Stamford, site, \$10,000; Amanta, site, \$5,000; Bay City, site, \$5,000; Beeville, site, \$5,000. These figures are subject to changes in conference.

WIFE SPUN ON HER HEAD

"Rube" Waddell, Erstwhile Pitcher Does a Crazy Stunt.

St. Louis, Mo., June 22.—"Rube" Waddell, erstwhile pitcher for the St. Louis Americans, was arraigned in the police court this morning for disturbing the peace. His wife declared he grabbed her by the foot and spun her around on her head, and says he is crazy as a bat. He was arrested at 2 a. m., after alarm was given by his wife, who feared for her life.

Will Be Tried Friday.

Waco, Texas, June 21.—Next Friday afternoon has been chosen as the date for the examining trial of Mrs. Minnie Lee Streight, charged with killing her husband, T. E. Streight, editor of the McGregor Mirror, who was killed at his home last Saturday night. The funeral of Streight took place this morning.

WHAT POWER TO REPEL?

War Department Is Called Upon to Show State of Preparedness to Protect the Pacific Coast.

Washington, D. C., June 22.—The house military affairs committee today voted to make a favorable report on the resolution of Representative McLean of California, calling on the war department to show the state of preparedness to repel an invasion of the Pacific coast. The war department has signified a willingness to furnish congress a statement showing the national defense, etc.

JUDSON HARMON AGAIN

Ohio Democrats Renominate Him For Governor, and He Makes Speech Denouncing the Tariff Law.

Dayton, Ohio, June 22.—Denouncing the republicans for "framing up a tariff to rob the people for the sake of special interests" Judson Harmon was renominated for governor today by acclamation at the state convention here. In accepting Harmon attacked the tariff, declaring the voters are imposed upon for private profit. The convention voted down a resolution to endorse a candidate for the United States senate.
