WIRELESS TELEPHONE INSTRU-
MENT WAS GIVEN DEMONSTRATION AT ROYALL NATIONAL
BANK TODAY.

Mr. Davidson, the agent here repre-
senting the Collins Wireless Tele-
graph and Telephone company, invit-
ed a few citizens to the Royall National
Bank this morning, to witness
demonstrations with a wireless tele-
phone. Mr. Davidson had for demon-
stration purposes a transmitter and a
receiver. The receiver is very similar
to those in general use on all tele-
phones. The transmitter was some-
what different. To each was attached
storage batteries. Mr. Davidson took
the transmitter into the vault of the
bank, made of steel, concrete, etc.,
and the visitors used the receiver in
turn on the outside, while they listen-
ed to Mr. Davidson's voice, explaining
the uses of the wireless, etc. The
voice was quite audible, and all ex-
pressed wonder over the marvelous
performance. There were no wire
connections between the two.

Those who witnessed the demonstra-
tions were Messrs. P. H. Hughes of
the local telephone company; D. J.
Price, general passenger agent of the
I. & G. N.; Geo. F. Price, Herbert
Hinzie, President Tucker Royall of
the bank, Clyde Hanks, cashier of
the bank, C. Roe Hall, W. M. Hamil-
ton of the Herald, and others.

No sound could be heard coming
from the vault, except by the one
holding the receiver. Through the re-
ceiver the voice sounded as does
voices coming over the ordinary tele-
phone.

The performance was a wonderful
one.

Slight depressions over Tennessee
and the New England states have
caused rain in the Gulf states, the
central and southern portions of the
Mississippi valley, the North Atlantic
states, and in the Ohio and Tennessee
valleys. An area of low pressure of
considerable energy overlies the
Plateau section and the western
Rocky mountain region. The follow-
ing heavy precipitation (in inches)
has been reported during the past
twenty-four hours: Cincinnati, 1.60;
Little Rock, 2.60. Temperature
changes have been slight in all sec-
tions of the country. The barometric
pressure indicates partly cloudy
weather for this vicinity tonight and
Wednesday, with showers tonight or
Wednesday.

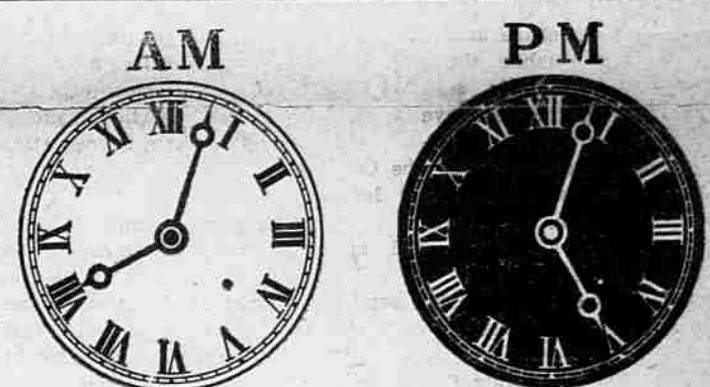
