TEXAS NEWS NOTES.

The fire rating board is expected to render its decision Wednesday. A reduction of rates is anticipated.
Ray Knowles was drowned in Leon river, near Belton.
Bob Stanley was called into his yard at his home in Mount Vernon and shot.
The contract has been let for the erection of the administration building of the Rice Institute at Houston.
A rumor indicates the probable extension of the Galveston-Houston interurban to connect at Dallas with the Denison line.
The state board of medical examiners meet today. One hundred and fifty applications are expected to come up for consideration.
Eight hundred miles of railroad was constructed in Texas during the fiscal year ending Thursday. The total mileage is expected to reach 14,000.
An effort will be made to change the state game laws.
Citizens of El Paso county petition the governor to recommend the enactment of a mineral law.
C. C. Portman was accidentally killed at Colorado.

Chicago's Hot Wave.
Chicago, Ill., June 27.—Seven deaths followed the continuation of the heat wave, which was slightly tempered Sunday by lake breezes. A suspicion of rain fell today, but only enough to be turned into steam as it fell.
Today's victims: Anthony Jay, aged 35; unidentified man, aged 65, found in hallway; Edwin Slagle, aged 75; Thomas Ellicott, Emil Frederickson, John Murphy, aged 68; John Schmerlitzen, aged 73.
Considerable mystery attaches to the identity of the aged man found in the hallway of the Municipal Court building at 4 o'clock this morning. He had no hat, coat nor vest; there was a small sum of money in his pockets, but absolutely nothing by which he could be identified.
Weather forecasters hold out no hope for rain tomorrow. Instead, they say it will be fair and probably much warmer.

Wending Suspect Held.
Galveston, June 27.—A man giving the name of H. F. Stewart was arrested here last night because he answered the description of Joseph Wending, who is wanted in Louisville for the murder of Alma Kellner. He denies he is the man wanted, but tells conflicting stories of his actions. Capt. J. P. Carney, a Louisville detective now in San Antonio, has wired that he will be here tomorrow. The arrest was made by Sheriff Winscom of Fort Bend county and Detective Bowe of the local force. Winscom trailed the suspect to this city and declares he is Wending.
