

## BARRY IS COMMANDER

Of the Pacific Fleet, Succeeding Rear Admiral Harber—Other Important Changes.

(Herald Special.)

Washington, D. C., Nov. 1.—Several important changes among the commanding officers of the Pacific fleet went into effect today. Rear Admiral Harber is succeeded as commander-in-chief of the fleet by Rear Admiral Edward B. Barry and Rear Admiral Chauncey Thomas replaces Rear Admiral Barry as commander of the second division of the fleet. Rear Admiral Barry, the new commander-in-chief, is from New York and the son of a naval officer. He has been in the navy since 1865, more than twenty-six years of that time being spent in sea service. Rear Admiral Thomas also is a native of New York, but was appointed to the navy from Pennsylvania forty-three years ago.

National Billiard League.

Chicago, Nov. 1.—The National Billiard League, promoted largely through the efforts of Johnny Kling, the Chicago National League baseball player, announces everything in readiness for the opening tonight of its winter tournament season. The cities in the league include New York, Chicago, Philadelphia, Boston, Kansas City, St. Louis, Pittsburg and Brooklyn. According to the present plans representative players of each city will play three games during the winter in each of the other seven cities of the league. The participants are confined to amateur players. The season will continue until the first week of April.

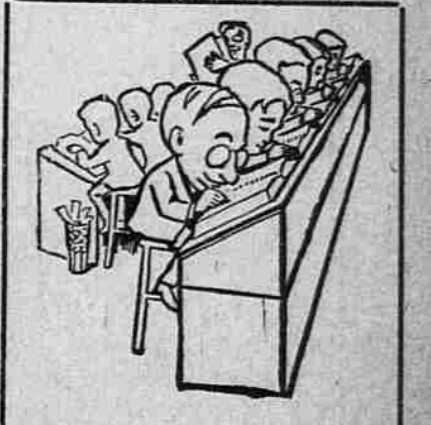
