#### CITY COMMISSIONERS

Met Monday Afternoon—Some Complication is Found in City School Property Tangle.

The board of city commissioners met yesterday afternoon at 2:30, with Commissioners Turner and Watts and the mayor present. After the reading of minutes, etc., a discussion of the city school property matter was entered into, and after hearing an opinion from City Attorney W. C. Campbell that title to the school property, in his opinion, was vested in the city, certain recommendations as to endorsement of insurance policies on school properties, etc., an invitation was extended to the school board to meet the commissioners at 7 p. m. for a conference. President Hamilton of the board was asked to call a meeting of the board to confer with the commissioners.

The city attorney made a report on the case of Mr. E. P. Gares, in which the city was sued for the death of a horse. He advised that the city agree to a dismissal of the case and the payment of the judgment and costs of suit, amounting to \$263.12. By resolution this was done.

The matter of sewer connections was fully discussed, and the city attorney was instructed to bring suit against certain parties who had failed to comply with the city ordinance

regulating same. Test cases are to be made of these, to determine just what power the city has in the premises.

Mr. Totty was before the board with a complaint that the raising of the grade on Avenue A had injured property owned by him on the avenue. It was decided the commissioners would go down and look the situation over, and then determine what to do with Mr. Totty's case.

All bills o. k'd were ordered paid. After discussion of various matters the board adjourned.

#### Met City School Board.

At 7 o'clock the conference was held with the school board, and the property muddle was fully discussed. Mayor Bowers, after a report was made from City Attorney Campbell, said he believed Mr. Campbell's decision was right, and the ownership of the property rested in the city, and not in the school board, therefore it became the duty of the city to make the necessary repairs, pay insurance, etc. But an obstacle was in the way, in the constitutional provision that 25 cents out of the \$100 valuation for taxes could be used for school purposes. This could only be remedied through a constitutional amendment. It was agreed that such amendment would be applied for at the next state legislature. It was also ordered through resolution by the school board that the insurance policies be so endorsed that the losses, if any, could be collected without a possible technical squabble, which might occur over the doubt as to where the title to the properties rested. These policies are now written in the name of the president of the school board.

The report submitted some weeks ago by the school board, asking for certain additions, repairs, etc., was discussed, and it was finally agreed that soon next year a bond issue would be submitted to the voters for money sufficient to do the necessary building, repairs, etc. This is a very important matter to the city and to the schools, as the buildings are inadequate, and more room must be provided. Besides much repairing is absolutely necessary for the preservation of the buildings, and to make them comfortable, more of which will be said later. The commissioners state that enough of the outstanding bonds will have been retired by then to make the new issue, sufficient for the purpose of building, repairing, etc., without an increase of taxation.
