

Stolen Goods Are Captured By Police

MANY CIGARS ARE HELD BY DETECTIVES

Bundle Lying in Old Freight Depot Door Is Found to Contain Costly Clothing for Woman.

Twelve boxes of cigars, said to be the property of S. P. Hickman, a local cigar manufacturer, were recovered by the city detectives Thursday. Willie Brown is under arrest.

According to the city detectives, Hickman's cigar factory at 811 San Antonio street was broken into several days ago and the cigars missing. They had been sold, the detectives say, to a negro club on South Oregon street.

The burglar with the "Christmas idea" who several nights ago entered the East El Paso drug store and carried away \$200 worth of Christmas novelties, has not been apprehended yet. There were some cigars included among the missing articles.

Immigration officers Thursday night located a bundle of clothing in a doorway of the old freight depot in the G. H. yards. The officers kept a watch on the bundle for several hours, but no one appeared to claim it. The bundle contained a dress of the latest pattern, a sweater and other women's wear.

The bundle was taken to the hotel. The detectives believe the articles were stolen and are holding them at the police station for identification.

Thursday night a burglar entered one of the rooms of the Texas Grand hotel on Texas street and carried away several suits of clothes and other clothing belonging to one of the men guests.

MIMIC BATTLE IS STAGED FOR 'MOVIES'
Another border battle took place Friday morning with all of the troops at Fort Bliss engaged in charging the common enemy, a motion picture camera, with Honor Scott, war photographer, entrenched behind it.

The battle was a mimic affair, arranged by Gen. H. L. Scott for the Albuquerque Film company. The films made Friday morning of cavalry, infantry and artillery movements will be "cut into" a story of love and war on the Mexican border. Deputy United States marshal C. R. Moore and a number of other police officers in El Paso assisted. The remainder of the film will be made in El Paso and Juarez.

POLICEMAN HAS STRUGGLE WITH A MAN HE ARRESTS
Augustin Gandara, arrested early Friday morning by patrolman Cromer, is being held at the police station on a charge of being a suspicious character. Cromer's report was that he saw Gandara enter the Pierson hotel, 27th and Kansas. A few minutes later he said that Gandara came running out of the place at full speed. Cromer had a struggle with the man before he submitted to being arrested.

ICELANDER RESCUES MINERS FROM FLOATING CAKE OF ICE
Winnipeg, Man., Dec. 19.—Baldly frozen and nearly starved, Thomas Leclair and Jack Fielding, Nevada gold miners, with two other prospectors were rescued from a floating cake of ice in Lake Winnipeg according to Fielding, who reported here Thursday night. The men were attempting to cross the lake on the ice last Saturday night when a cake of ice broke loose and carried them away. They were rescued Tuesday morning by an Icelandic settler.

ESCARZOZA MUST SERVE 14 YEARS

Rodrigo Escarzoza, who testified that he had never before been convicted of a felony in order to secure a suspended sentence of four years given him on a charge of burglary, was assessed a punishment of 14 years on a charge of perjury by a jury in the 34th district court Friday morning. This makes a total of 14 years that Escarzoza will have to serve.

CUT ON ARM CAUSE OF ARREST OF MAN

Sebastian Minjares, who had a cut on his right arm, was arrested and is being held in connection with the death of Tomas Ramirez, who was shot and killed early Wednesday morning. According to the police, Minjares was unable to give an explanation of the cut. He was treated at the police station for it and later was locked up. Minjares, it is said, was the last man seen with Ramirez before his body was found.

COMPLAINS ABOUT WOMAN AND IS PUT UNDER ARREST
John J. Hollane, who went to the police station Thursday night with a complaint against a woman, was himself locked up on a charge of being drunk and a suspicious character. The man, according to the police, claimed that a woman had taken \$30 from him. The police say the man had some "dope" for horses.
